#### Re: Rector's Mid-Year Report

It has been almost eight months since our Annual Meeting (held each year in early February). This is my Mid-Year Rector's Report. Please read it prayerfully and carefully:

We are a church family committed to Christian worship in the great tradition, biblical preaching and teaching, evangelism, outreach, discipleship and local and global mission. We are committed to sharing the Truth of God's Word in love with all persons.

- Outreach (World Mission): In addition to our annual donation to our sister congregation St. Mary's Anglican Church, Kumasi, Ghana, we were able to send an additional \$4,000 (US) dollars this year (yes, \$4,000!!!). This will greatly bless our Christian brothers and sisters in Africa and enable them to complete their new church building and mission center. God be praised! My sincere thanks to those who have generously donated to our world mission ministry. Additionally, we continue to support a young woman missionary serving in a very dangerous part of East Asia (which must remain undisclosed for her safety) and the Bishop & Trudy Harvey Legacy Fund which aides ministries to youth in Canada and the United States. "Declare his glory among the nations and his marvelous works among all the peoples!" (1 Chronicles 16:24)
- Youth Evangelism (Part 1): We have received a \$3,000 (Canadian Funds) Grant from, "*The Bishop & Trudy Harvey Legacy Fund*," to bless our inner-city youth ministry. This comes to approximately \$2,500 (in US Funds). \$500 has already provided financial aid to the youth from the French Hill Neighborhood and others in our City who are in financial need, enabling them to attend Young Life Camp this year on Saranac Lake, Saranac, NY (from Saturday, August 12 Wednesday, August 16). I am pleased to say that we are a founding church in the effort to bring Young Life (an ecumenical, Bible-based, Christian Ministry who seeks to introduce the Gospel to our youth and our local schools) in Marlborough. Several middle-schoolers attend "*Club*" at our house once a month. In addition to the Young Life Staff, some of our own HTAC college aged adults are taking an interest in seeing Young Life come alive in our local neighborhood and City. The remaining funds will help our local youth ministry with an emphasis on reaching the youth of our City with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. "*For the promise [of the covenant] is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself.*" (Acts of the Apostles 2:39)
- Youth Evangelism (Part 2): Three youth from our greater church family attended the St. Michael's Conference with me this year. Sadly this is the smallest number of youth to attend the Conference in well over a decade. I serve as a member of the faculty at this conference. However, all three youth in attendance enthusiastically rated the week a strong 9 out of 10 and look forward to attending next year. Most of all, those who attended this year said their Christian faith had grown and that the conference had a significant impact on them. The St. Michael Conference is a teaching conference in the, "*High Church Anglican Tradition*". Unlike Young Life which seeks to introduce youth to Jesus and his Gospel (which is very much needed in our day), the St. Michael's Conference is a "Teaching Conference". Its goal is discipleship; helping young believers grow in their faith and knowledge of the Lord! Please help support this Conference in the coming years and thus help make a real difference in the lives of our children. "*And these words that I command you today [saith the Lord] shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise." (Deuteronomy 6:6-7)*

- Youth Evangelism (Part 3): This year's Vacation Bible School (VBS) was perhaps the very best VBS yet! God be praised! Many thanks to Monica Walker (Director), Steve Walker, Jennie O'Leary, Lindsay Hassard, Kelly Skoog (Co-Director) and a whole host of volunteers from HTAC and our friends at The First United Methodist Church (FUMC), Marlborough. I am blessed to say that we continue to offer VBS with our brothers and sisters at the FUMC. Just shy of 40 children participated in this year's VBS, plus several teen helpers. It was a great week with a wonderful fun-filled finale on Friday night. My thanks and congratulations to all involved! "And [the people] were bringing children to Jesus that he might touch them, and the disciples rebuked them. But when Jesus saw it, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands on them." (Mark 10:13-16)
- **Outreach/Local Mission (Part 1):** Once again we offered a Nine-Week Summer Lunch Program, Monday -Friday, under the leadership of Kathleen Demers. This ministry provides a nutritious lunch to the children and others of our neighborhood during the summer school break. One week this summer we served 256 lunches to children and some adults in need. Overall, we served **1,697** lunches this summer!!! Well done Kathleen and crew! "*If you pour yourself out for the hungry and satisfy the desire of the afflicted, then shall your light rise in the darkness and your gloom be as the noonday.*" (Isaiah 58:10)
- Christian Relations (Ecumenism): I am blessed to belong to a small group, (known as, "John 17:21"), of evangelical pastors (this group was recently formed) in the French Hill Neighborhood and the surrounding Marlborough area. There are five of us who meet twice a month to pray, share Christian fellowship, read Scripture, share our stories and encourage one another in the ministry and the Gospel. We meet in the church office of HTAC. It is my hope that some of them will help us in implementing "June's Table" (please see below); a very important evangelism and outreach ministry in our local neighborhood. [Jesus said] "That they [Christians] may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me." (John 17:21)
- BIG NEWS!!! Outreach/Local Mission (Part 2): On November 4<sup>th</sup>, we will begin serving a meal to the hungry, recovering, homeless and/or sheltered of the French Hill Neighborhood and our City at 5:00 p.m. While we hope to partner with other churches and organizations in order to serve every Saturday, we will begin by serving on the first and third Saturday with volunteers from HTAC. June's Table, named after June Davis (a beloved member of our church family and manager of the local recovery houses who passed away in 2016), will augment the ministry of, "Our Father's Table," which feeds the hungry of Marlborough three times a week. We received a matching grant of \$9,000+ from the Matthew 25 Initiative within our Province, the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA). Thus, for every dollar raised another dollar will be given to support June's Table by this generous provincial grant. I am very pleased to announce that we have reached our goal (mostly from outside donations)!!! Thus, we have \$18,000+ to help us begin feeding the hungry and homeless of our neighborhood and City. Further donations are most welcome and will help sustain this important ministry for years to come. In addition, HTAC also has a small food pantry to help persons in the local neighborhood in need. Please remember the hungry when shopping each week and donate to our HTAC Food Pantry. "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me." (Matthew 25:34-35)
- Outreach/Local Mission (Part 3): We are pleased to offer a home to a growing AA Group every Friday night at HTAC. In addition, we continue to reach out to the recovery houses on our street and in the local area. I have a particular place in my heart for this ministry. We will continue to come alongside our brothers and sisters who struggle with addiction and those who suffer with dual diagnoses. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)
- Liturgical: Firstly, my thanks to Stephen Carlson on his Eagle Project. We have a beautiful new Altar Rail due to his hard work. Well done Stephen! Soon we hope to have a gate to the Sanctuary and a permanent kneeling pad (one more substantial than our temporary kneeling pad). On another note, my sincere thanks and deep gratitude to David Baker, our beloved Organist and Choir Director, our Cantor(s) & Choir, Russ Harris

and all our Servers, our Clergy and others who make worship so special at HTAC especially on the Lord's Day. What we offer is (alas) no longer common in many churches, but it is faithful and beautiful! "*How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven.*" (Genesis 28:17)

• **Prayer/New Prayer Chain:** Since our Annual Meeting in mid-February, we have been blessed with a new prayer chain under the leadership of Emily Morse. If you have any prayer needs or requests, please contact Emily whose information is listed in, "*The Messenger*", the Sunday bulletin, and often mentioned in the, "*E-News*". "[Pray] at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints [i.e., in all the church]." (Ephesians 6:18)

#### A Collect for Thanksgiving Day:

Almighty and gracious Father, we give thee thanks for the fruits of the earth in their season and for the labors of those who harvest them.
