The 2018 HTAC Midyear Rector's Report

Dear Members & Friends of Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Marlborough, MA (HTAC),

"For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function [i.e., ministry], so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another" (ESV: Romans 12:4-5). Therefore, let us love one another, pray for one another, come alongside one another and encourage one another in the Lord and his ministry among us and all to his honour and glory!

2018 has been another year of blessings. God be praised for his continued goodness and mercies towards us in our church family.

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father ..." (ESV: James 1:17).

A few highlights:

- March 10 (Spirituality & Discipleship) Dcn. Rhonda offered a Lenten Quiet Day, an annual event within the life of our church, which profoundly blessed those in attendance. This is a wonderful example of a number of opportunities for spiritual growth and discipleship offered at HTAC throughout the church year. My thanks to Dcn. Rhonda for calling persons to set aside some quiet time during the Lenten Season to simply be with our Lord and to listen for his voice! Well done Dcn. Rhonda! "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10a).
- March 23 (Worship & Evangelism) On this particular Friday evening, Bishop Harvey and Fr. Michael were led by a thurifer (i.e., incense-bearer) and two men carrying a large wooden cross as we processed alongside Lincoln Street. We were joined by other clergy of our parish and archdeaconry, choir members, readers, evangelists, healing ministers and others in offering, *The Stations of the Cross*, on our street; literally bringing the story and saving acts of Jesus to the streets of our neighborhood. I was particularly moved that we had both adult and youth evangelists ready to engage persons of all ages with the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. "Then Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24).
- Holy Week 2018 We were sincerely blessed to have, "Our Dear Bishop Emeritus", The Right Reverend Donald F. Harvey, Founding Bishop of our Diocese (ANiC), with us for Holy Week and especially for The Sacred Triduum (i.e., Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the Great Vigil of the Resurrection, as well as for Easter Morning) "Then he [The Risen Lord] opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem" (Luke 24:45-47).
- April 15 (Worship & Thanksgiving) This date marked our fourth anniversary in occupying our new church home on Lincoln Street which serves as a center for Christian worship, evangelism and outreach in our neighborhood, city and beyond. We celebrated our anniversary with a special Mass, known as, "Beth El Sunday" (i.e., "House of God Sunday") on May 6. "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven." (Genesis 28:17).
- April 15 (Global Mission) Fr. Jess Cantelon, a priest and missionary of our diocese to Jerusalem, preached at the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Solemn High Mass and offered a thought provoking and insightful presentation on his important ministry in Jerusalem, Israel during our Adult Christian Education hour. This was truly a special event within the life of our church family. Follow up: On Thursday, May 17, the HTAC Parish Council unanimously passed a motion to add Fr. Jess and his family among those whom we at HTAC support prayerfully and financially in the area of Global Mission. In addition to Fr. Jess' ministry in Jerusalem, we support our sister congregation St. Mary's Anglican Church in Kumasi, Ghana; a missionary to East Asia (the location of her ministry remains undisclosed for her safety); and The Bishop Donald & Trudy Harvey Legacy Fund, supporting youth ministry throughout our diocese. "[Jesus said], "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem...How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! (Luke 13:34). Please pray for the conversion and peace of all Jerusalem and Israel.

- April 28 (Spirituality and Discipleship) On this Saturday, following a wonderful HTAC Men's Breakfast and teaching led by Dan Morse, we held our first, "Sons of the Holy Cross" meeting. I am very pleased to say that seven men from our church family were in attendance, with an eighth sending his regrets due to work travel. This means that 10% of our total average Sunday attendance were present for this initial meeting --- men seeking, "to go deeper in their Christian/Catholic spirituality in Christ Jesus through the Scriptures and the writings of the early Church Fathers and English Reformers". As Rector, I am truly blessed by this recent development among the men of our church family! While writing this report, we are presently looking forward to our second meeting on Saturday, June 2. Please Note: There is a growing interest also among the women of our church family regarding the, "Daughters of the Holy Cross". God be praised! Please stay tuned. "Everyone then who hears these words of mine [saith the Lord] and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock" (Matthew 7:24-25).
- May 6 (Evangelism & Church Planting...BIG, BIG NEWS...Spanish Speaking Church Plant!) La gracia del Señor Jesucristo, el amor de Dios y la comunión del Espíritu Santo sean con todos vosotros. As many of you know, our church plant in Medway, MA has, after a number of successful years and recent hard times, sadly closed. The few remaining parishioners are being ministered to on a regular basis (e.g., receiving the Gospel, Anointing, Absolution and Holy Communion). Glory to God, for he continually works all things for good in the hearts of those who love him - and we do love him! (see, Romans 8:28). Bishop Charlie Masters, our Diocesan Bishop, has given his episcopal permission (i.e., his permission as our Bishop; "episkopos" is Greek for, "Bishop", and "overseer of the flock"), for us to launch a new Spanish speaking mission/church plant out of HTAC, Marlborough, MA. The new church plant will be named, "Misi'on Anglicana San Antonio" (i.e., "St. Anthony Anglican Mission"). Under my direction, Fr. Isaac Fisher, who speaks Spanish, and Dcn. John DeMartinis (both from our former church plant in Medway, MA) will be launching this new mission out of HTAC. Over the coming months, we will be canvassing the French Hill Neighborhood, handing out pamphlets on Prayer Walks and reaching out to our Spanish speaking neighbors through VBS (in July), June's Table on Saturday evenings (while feeding the hungry), the Summer Lunch Program, Young Life, etc. Please pray for this new church plant to reach many Spanish speaking persons with the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ and the historic Catholic Faith in our neighborhood and beyond. "And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20).
- May 10 (Worship & Evangelism) On Thursday, May 10, Kathleen Demers, HTAC People's Warden and I met with Trish Pope, Director of the Marlborough Senior Center, to discuss our (i.e., HTAC) offering a new Dementia/Alzheimer's' friendly Worship Service for persons in our City and beyond once a month this Service will begin very soon. How very blessed are we to be called to serve these persons and their caretakers by offering the love, Gospel and Mass of Christ Jesus our Lord to them!!! Please stay tuned for more details. [Jesus said,] "I was sick and you visited me..." (Matthew 25:36).
- May 2018 (Evangelism & Outreach): As of the writing of this report, we are now offering June's Table (a ministry to the hungry, the recovering, the homeless, the sheltered, etc., of our local neighborhood and beyond), an evening meal 4 out of 5 Saturdays a month! Once again, God be praised for his goodness and mercies toward us, that we would be counted worthy to serve his people in this way!!! I have also met with the Pastor, and subsequently a lay member, of a French Hill Neighborhood "Bible-Believing Christian Congregation" who seems very interested in working/ministering with us to fill the last Saturday needed in the month. Soon we will be feeding those in need every Saturday: 1st Saturday HTAC; 2nd Saturday Students of AMSA (i.e., The Advanced Math & Science Academy in Marlborough); 3rd Saturday HTAC; 4th Saturday Still TBD and the 5th Saturday The Marlborough Rotary Club. My heart rejoices! "For I [the Lord] was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me..." (Matthew 25:35).
- Summer Lunch Program 2018: For the past few years, we at HTAC have offered a summer lunch program (over nine summer weeks) serving children of our neighborhood who are out of school a nutritious lunch. This ministry does just that. In 2017 we served 1,697 lunches to mostly children in need.

<u>BIG NEWS</u>: On Friday, April 6 we received a \$6,000 check to help us continue this most valuable ministry to children out of our church. However, this amount, which is most gracious, will only last two years. Please pray that we will be able to offer this ministry for several years to come and beyond. *Jesus said, "See that you do not despise one of these little ones. For I tell you that in heaven their angels always see the face of my Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 18:10).*

Yes, there is still more good news: 1) As noted on page 1 of this newsletter, the President of, "Forward in Faith North America" (FIFNA), Fr. Lawrence Bausch, a priest of the ACNA, will be speaking, preaching and teaching at HTAC on Saturday, June 2 and Sunday, June 3...this is a special event within the life of our church and I sincerely hope that all of our clergy and members will be in attendance; 2) 11 of our regular attendees at Young Life Club (which is held at my house 2x a month on a Saturday evening), plus 2 more youths from Marlborough, MA will be attending Young Life Camp this August (this is huge my friends!!!). Many of these youth are just coming to know our Lord and his Gospel. Thus, we are reaching out to the unchurched. Among the leaders who will be attending camp this year - not included among the 11 campers - is our own Jennie O'Leary (I am extremely proud of Jennie and her new involvement and ministry with Young Life...way to go Jennie!); 3) We had a wonderful Min-Mike's Day (a one day introduction to and reunion for members of, "The St. Michael's Conference," a week long summer Christian Youth Conference in the High Church Anglican Tradition for all young persons ages 14 - 21 (i.e., High School through College). I have been most honoured to be part of this almost 60 year tradition in New England and its faculty since my coming to HTAC 14 years ago. 4) I have been in contact with some Christian Ministers of the Gospel who are discerning a call to join our Diocese (ANiC) and our New England Archdeaconry. I will keep you up-to-date as things unfold. 5) We will soon have a new permanent sign on our Outreach Center to help highlight June's Table and other important ministries and events at HTAC. 6) Lastly, as you know, the costs for snow plowing and clearing was astronomical this past winter - approximately \$23,000 (makes the heart sad). These costs deeply wounded our church budget and financial reserves. Good news, it looks like we have someone for coming winter (2018-19) who will provide these services at, "Mercy Rates"! Please pray for all of this to come to fruition.

Thus, there is much for us as a church family to be thankful for. Also, all of these blessings have emerged since our Annual Meeting in early/mid February (only three months ago!!!). God is at work among us my dear friends. Let us pray often and serve when and where we can.

I will end this mid-year report as I began it: Let us love one another, pray for one another, come alongside one another and encourage one another in the Lord and his ministry among us and all to his honour and glory!


