WHO ARE WE WITHIN THE GREATER CHRISTIAN FAMILY? ARE WE CATHOLIC OR ARE WE PROTESTANT?

Anglicanism (1): Anglicanism ***IS NOT*** a protestant denomination per se (i.e., it claims no human founder [e.g., Martin Luther, John Calvin, John Wesley or any other human person or movement], where the founder's writings, in addition to the holy Scriptures, carry exceptional theological influence and where the local synod, convention, conference, etc., is the final authority on matters of faith and morals). This ***IS NOT*** orthodox biblical Anglicanism! It never has been! The Principle of the English Reformation (something related to, yet distinct from, the Continental Reformation) is: *To return the Church of England (and subsequently, those in communion with and/or born of her), to the Faith and Order of the undivided Catholic Church under the primacy and authority of the Holy Scriptures as God's Word (apart from the additions and abuses of the Medieval Church of Rome and the deletions of the more radical Reformers on the continent).* The "Via Media" of Anglicanism is a genuine attempt to return to the Faith and Order of the early Church (i.e., with a strong emphasis on the first 500 years of Christian history).

Anglicanism claims no Scriptures of her own, no sacraments of her own, no creeds (i.e., statements of faith) of her own, no ecumenical councils of her own and no orders of ministry of her own. Rather, orthodox Anglicanism maintains and celebrates the Scriptures, sacraments, creeds, councils and apostolic ministry of the undivided Catholic Church.

Anglicanism (2): Anglicanism has always claimed to be a communion/fellowship of the once undivided Catholic Church of the first Christian millennium founded by Christ Jesus our Lord and his holy Apostles (and not a protestant denomination per se). ***HOWEVER***, the undivided Catholic Church, to which we as orthodox Anglicans belong, should not be confused with the Roman Catholic Church which emerged in its present form later in western Christian history. Anglicanism, since the time of the English Reformation, has never claimed to be part of the emerging Roman Catholic Church of that period, nor has it claimed to be a new church or a protestant denomination. Rather, orthodox Anglicanism claims - and always has - to be a communion/fellowship of the historic Catholic Church in today's world.

Thus, while reformed (in every age according to the holy Scriptures as God's Word) and evangelical, orthodox Anglicanism is fully Catholic. She is a communion/fellowship of the once undivided and historic Catholic Church (described above).

Historic Reference: *"The Anglican Communion," Archbishop Geoffrey Fisher wrote, "has no peculiar thought, practice, creed or confession of its own. It has only the Catholic Faith of the ancient Catholic Church, as preserved in the Catholic Creeds and maintained in the Catholic and Apostolic constitution of Christ's Church from the beginning. It may licitly teach as necessary for salvation nothing but what is read in the Holy Scriptures as God's Word written or may be proved thereby. It therefore embraces and affirms such teachings of the ancient Fathers and Councils of the Church as are agreeable to the Scriptures, and thus to be counted apostolic. The Church has no authority to innovate: it is obliged continually, and particularly in times of renewal or reformation, to return to "the faith once delivered to the saints."*

THE INFINITE, UNCHANGING LOVE OF GOD

Today, Monday, September 20, 2018 – the below is being resubmitted by the instruction of the Holy Spirit!

The love of Christ will give you strength for the impossible. Looking back over these last 3 years with Scotty, I guess was stressful. My dearest Scotty had been deteriorating slowly at first and then lost momentum the last 4 months. During this time I was not actually aware of the stress. My God thru the Holy Spirit and the love of Christ gave me such strength that it was beyond explanation. The love Scotty and I shared was supernatural the last months of his life with me. The night of his departure (May 21, 2017), which only he and I shared, was magnificent, as our Savior met him at the door, and welcomed him home. The room was filled with a light that cannot be explained.

Have you ever felt your love for others growing thin during stressful times? That's when we need to remember that love is a decision, not a feeling, and we choose to love.

In Matthew 24: 12-14, Jesus tells us to persevere in our love for God through difficult times: "Because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold. But he who endures to the end shall be saved." He then says: "and this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come" v.14

As believers, our goal is to see the word is spoken to all who we encounter. To preach the gospel to the world, and our motivation is His love.

Galatians 6: 9 promises, "And let us not grow weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap, if we do not lose heart". We don't want to lose a great harvest because we have grown weary.

How do we get love that perseveres? This can only come from God, who is love. 1 John 4:8 tells us, "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son." How awesome is this that our God loved us so much that he allowed His Son to suffer the agony of such a cruel death for us.

Get rid of wrong thoughts so you don't react based on old ways of thinking – out of fear, loneliness or lack. There is no limit to His love, grace and provision.

Paul writes in Ephesians 2: 4-5: "But God, who is rich in mercy, out of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ". If you feel rejected or anxious, capture every negative thought and put it under the dominion of Jesus.

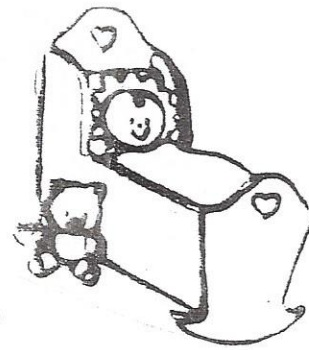
Paul prays: Ephesians 3: 17-19, "and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have power to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

Love is not just an attribute of God; it is His very essence, and He pours it into us. His love is infinite, timeless and unchanging. It is so big, it includes all people for all time – even those you may be tempted to hate. He died for them. Ephesians 5: 1-2 "Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." Tap into this on a daily bases, the love of Christ will give you **strength for the impossible**.

From our People's Warden

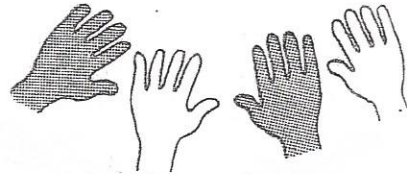

Wyldlife & Young Life

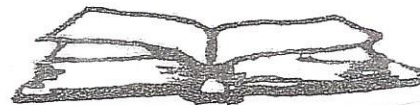

Father Michael’s days off

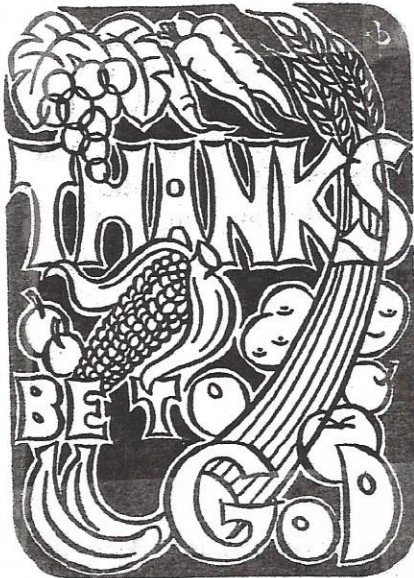
