The Church Year: Participating in God's Story of Salvation!

On December 2, 2018, the First Sunday in Advent, we begin the Christian liturgical year anew. The Christian year consists of: 1) Advent (with a focus on the Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in Glory to judge the living and the dead - please see Matthew 25:31-46); 2) Christmas (with a focus on the Lord's first coming, not only as the Babe born in Bethlehem, but as the Lord and Saviour of the whole world - please see Genesis 3:15; Luke 2:4-21 and John 3:16-17); 3) Epiphany (God's revelation of His Son Jesus Christ as fully God and fully Man; i.e., Emmanuel - God with us - please see Isaiah 60:1; John 1:1-18; Ephesians 3:3; Colossians 2:2-3; Matthew 2:1ff); 4) Lent and Holy Week (entering into the baptism, ministry, suffering and passion of our dear Lord for the sins of the whole world - see Isaiah 53:1-12; 1 Peter 2:24); 5) Easter/Resurrection and Ascension (see references below); 6) Pentecost (see references below) and 7) several Principal and Lesser Feast Days proclaiming the Good News of Jesus and His presence with His Church until the end of the time.

The Christian liturgical year enables us, by the Holy Spirit and grace of God, to enter into God's story of salvation through: 1) the gathering of the Christian community (Greek, ecclesia); 2) the proclamation of the Word within the fellowship of the gathered community (Greek, ecclesia, koinonia) and 3) the celebration of Sacrament(s) (Greek, ecclesia, koinonia and anamnesis). We are actually participants in God's story of salvation through the Mass - Christian worship on the Lord's Day (see Justin Martyr's description of early Christian worship on the Lord's Day as he experienced it during his life time beginning sometime in the Apostolic Age). Through the Eucharist (the Mass) we participate in God's story of: the creation; the fall of humanity (i.e., the introduction of sin, suffering and death into God's first creation); the promise of redemption (see Genesis 3:15); the covenant/promise to Abraham (Genesis 15:1-6); the incarnation - life – baptism and ministry - death - resurrection - and ascension of Jesus Christ our Lord and the fulfillment of the covenant made to Abraham (John 8:56); the gift of the Holy Spirit (Acts. 2:1-11); the second coming of Jesus and the fulfillment of all things. We are not simply giving thanks for salvation history when we gather as God's people to celebrate the Holy Eucharist in the Mass on the Lord's Day (or during the week), we are actual participants in God's story of salvation, the story of our redemption!

Anglicans believe that divine worship transcends that which is earthly and ordinary. The Mass is something heavenly and extraordinary; a meeting place between God and man, the Creator and his creation, a place where the infinite and the finite, the eternal and the temporal meet. "Then Jacob awoke from his sleep and said, "Surely the LORD is in this place, and I did not know it... How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven" (Genesis 28:16).

Robert E. Webber wrote: "Although worship dramatizes an event that happened long ago, it brings that event into the present [Greek, anamnesis] by the power of the Holy Spirit. In each worship experience, I am present in the actual event... On Christmas I am present at the birth of Christ; on Epiphany I am there at the presentation of Christ; on Maundy Thursday I am present at the Last Supper; on Good Friday I am taken to the cross and put into the tomb; on Easter I stand at the empty tomb; and on Pentecost Sunday I receive the Holy Spirit." Robert E. Webber, (Worship Is a Verb: Celebrating God's Mighty Deeds of Salvation Peabody, MA: Hendrickson Publishing, 1992), 119-120.

This concept (anamnesis) was something understood by God's people the Jews long before the coming of Jesus. That is, God invites us into his story as participants. Through sacramental worship (i.e., gathering, Word and Sacrament), the past becomes a present reality enabling the believer to share in God's story and the benefits thereof!

If we understand and believe this, we will strive to be present on the Lord's Day for Mass and perhaps during the week. To share in the Mass (i.e., the gathering, Word and Sacrament) is to share in Him and His story of salvation. God's story becomes our story. We will also mourn when persons are absent on the Lord's Day and long to bring the Word and Sacrament to the sick and homebound.

A Second Century Description of Christian Worship on the Lord's Day (The Mass)

"...For all that we receive we bless the Maker of all things through his Son *Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.

And on the day which is called the Sun's Day [the Lord's Day] there is an assembly of all who live in the city, towns or the country; and the memoirs of the apostles and the writings of the prophets are read [the Readings], as much as time permits. When the reader has finished, the Celebrant gives a discourse [Sermon], admonishing us and exhorting us to imitate these excellent examples. Then we all rise together and offer prayer [Prayers of the People]; bread is brought and wine and water; and the Celebrant offers up prayers and thanksgiving [in Greek, "eucharist"] and the people assent with "Amen." Then follows the distribution of the Eucharistic gifts and the partaking of them by all; and they are sent to the absent by the hands of the deacons...We hold our common assembly on the Sun's Day because it is the first day on which God put to flight darkness and chaos and made the world; and on this day *Jesus Christ our Saviour rose from the dead...He appeared to his Apostles and Disciples and taught them these things, which we have handed on to you" (Justin Martyr, 150 AD).

New Year Resolution (beginning Advent 1): It is my sincere hope that all of us will be present on every Sunday morning (if at all possible) for worship and partake in the story of God's salvation and the benefits thereof offered through the gathering of His people (that is, you and me), His holy Word and His life-giving Sacraments.

THE NAMES OF GOD

Fr. Michael has asked Todd Murphy, a postulant for holy orders in our diocese sponsored by HTAC, to offer an adult Christian Education course studying the most important names of God revealed in sacred scripture. The study will progress chronologically through the canon (i.e., the books of the Bible) so as to demonstrate how divine revelation unfolds within the canon of Scripture and throughout salvation history. There is a total of 27 names for God from Genesis 1 to the end of the New Testament. This Class will meet on Sundays from 12 Noon - 1:00 p.m. in the church. The course will begin on Sunday, December 2.

For each name Todd Murphy, who is well versed in Hebrew and the ancient texts, will deal with the Hebrew name for God, and its Greek or Aramaic equivalent. He will take an in-depth look at the use of these names in their respective contexts which will give us much more meat on which to ruminate. The discussion should be stimulating.



Encouraging news from the 40 days for life campaign!

The 40 days for life campaign ended November 4. Thank you for your prayers. Official reports from the beginning of the 40 days for life campaign in 2007 are: We have seen God save 15,235 babies from abortion... close down 99 abortion centers... and helped 186 workers quit the abortion industry and seek work for life. The next campaign begins Ash Wednesday and runs until Palm Sunday (March 6 – April 14, 2019).

Right to Life Sunday is January 20th. Watch for informational leaflets in the bulletins that day.


