Dear Members & Friends of Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Marlborough, MA,

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Re: My recent time among our friends in Via Apostolica ("The Apostolic Way").

I wanted to share some highlights from my recent visit with our Christian brothers and sisters serving in Via Apostolica and my time with them at their Cathedral in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada!

I returned to New England on Tuesday, May 21 from a wonderfully Spirit-filled conference. It was the very best North American conference I have attended in some time and was certainly one of the spiritual highlights of my year thus far! The conference focused on the Resurrection of Jesus (i.e., how are we to understand the Resurrection of Jesus Christ both biblically and theologically according to faith and writings of early Church and how are we to engage our present culture in North America as partakers in the risen life of Jesus Christ through Word, Sacrament and everyday Christian ministry and living?). Good stuff! Our culture desperately needs to hear the Good News of our Risen Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ! We are called to share the truth of his Word in love. However, we need Spirit-filled inspiration and biblical training to help make this happen. How do we go about making Jesus Christ and his holy Word known (anew) within our North American culture? How do we reach young persons/families with the Gospel in such a way that it changes their lives for all eternity?

The conference proved to be a time of genuine spiritual healing and renewal for me personally, for which I am most grateful to God. This conference was, as they used to say, "Just what the Doctor ordered!" Thus, my heartfelt thanks to everyone who prayed for me. I also reconnected with and met several persons, both clergy and lay, whom I now consider friends in Christ Jesus our Risen Lord. I am thankful to God for them.

Just prior to the conference, I had the distinct honour of preaching, at the invitation of Bishop Todd Atkinson, Bishop of Via Apostolica, at the ordination of three new Deacons in Christ's holy Catholic Church (one of whom was a Scotsman from the Highlands who stands a mere 6 foot 7 inches tall). His Scottish brogue was like music to my ears! It was so cool to hear him proclaim the Gospel!! The ordination was the first time Bishop Todd invited someone to preach (in his place) at an ordination within his missionary movement (no pressure...LOL)! Yes, I mentioned Elvis!

Special Memory: I was spiritually moved when I witnessed these three men of God weep as they took their ordination vows before God, their Bishop and the Church, "I [name]] do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God and to contain all things necessary to salvation, and I consequently hold myself bound to conform my life and ministry thereto, and therefore I do solemnly engage to conform to the Doctrine, Discipline, and Worship of Christ as this Church has received them". They genuinely and evidently were blessed to be received, despite their own personal brokenness and unworthiness, into the Ordained Ministry of Christ Jesus our great High Priest and his holy Catholic Church. I wept with them.

Via Apostolica was recently received as a missionary movement within our North American Province, The Anglican Church in North America (ACNA) and is now sponsored and supported by our Diocesan Bishop, Bishop Charlie Masters and our Diocese (ANiC). Bishop Todd and Via Apostolica have been attending our ANiC Diocesan Synod for several years now. Bishop Harvey, our Bishop Emeritus, prepared these three men (mentioned above) for ordination during a pre-ordination retreat a couple of weeks earlier. Bishop Trevor Walters, one of our Diocesan (ANiC) Suffragan Bishops, who serves in western Canada, was invited as a guest speaker at the conference (he has attended this conference in Lethbridge for several years now). Thus, our Diocese is very

closely connected to Bishop Todd and Via Apostolica. Bishop Charlie, our Diocesan Bishop, has asked us as an Archdeaconry to help foster and develop a growing relationship and partnership in the Gospel with Via Apostolica. I am pleased to say that our Bishop's vision has already begun to bear fruit! We have much to share with and to learn from one another.

Things I was pleased to notice/highlights: 1) They have a great respect for the office, ministry and gifts of their Bishop and genuinely honour his authority within the Church and Church Order; 2) They have a deep devotion to our Lord Jesus Christ, his holy Word and his holy Catholic Church (e.g., to the sacraments, the Catholic creeds, the ecumenical councils, patristic writings, ancient liturgies, etc.). Yet, they hunger to know more and more. This is why they invited me, to bless them. However, the more I shared, the more I realized how very much I/we can learn from them as well. They have a strong evangelism ministry (reaching out to and bringing many young people and young families into the faith), a wonderful discipleship ministry, a profound women's ministry (with woman serving as teachers, licensed preachers and licensed trained spiritual directors), and beneficial guidelines for healing and other charismatic ministries.

An important Note: A number of the clergy and laity, as well as Bishop Todd himself (I am most humbled to share) mentioned how much they can learn from me/us in New England. Via Apostolica, once an independent charismatic/evangelical congregation, has been on a 12+ year journey toward Anglicanism and the historic faith and order of the undivided Catholic Church. Their journey has not been an easy one. Their obedience to Christ's call has been one of great sacrifice and sadly, has been filled with many tears. The journey has also been filled with much joy as they followed the call of God placed upon them, first as a Congregation, then as a missionary movement (with a growing number of church/ministry plants) and now as part of our Province (ACNA).

Bishop Todd and his wife Cheri were with our clergy and spouses at a Conference last year in Boothbay Harbor, ME. Bishop Todd then preached at HTAC on the following Sunday. Bishop Todd, who has a great love for the Faith and Order of Christ's holy Catholic Church as traditionally received in Anglicanism is also rather charismatic. He preached the Word of God at HTAC with great enthusiasm. I remember my Rebecca saying to me (commenting on Bishop Todd's preaching style), "He's very excited about Jesus!" I replied, "Daddy's exited about Jesus too!!!" LOL!

Bishop Todd and Cheri will be with us once again this October and will join us for Solemn High Mass and our anniversary celebration and Reception on Sunday, October 6; a very special day within the life of our church family and New England Archdeaconry. I am pleased to announce that The Very Reverend (Fr.) Stephen Barbour and his wife Jessica will also be joining us. Fr. Stephen serves as Dean of the (Via Apostolica) Cathedral in Lethbridge, Alberta. I had the pleasure of hearing both Dean (Fr.) Stephen and Jessica teach at the conference I attended. And the joy does not stop there: Bishop Charlie & Judy Masters, Bishop Don & Trudy Harvey and Bishop Todd and Cheri Atkinson will all be with us for this special event.

Thank you for all of your prayerful support and love in Christ Jesus our Risen Lord & Saviour! I am blessed to serve as your priest!



Fr. Michael's Sabbatical

(reprinted from the E-news in May)

Dear Members & Friends of HTAC, Marlborough, MA, Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Please Note: While I will be present on most Sundays throughout the 2019 summer, I will be away some during the week (M - Sat). Every seven years, the Rector is blessed by a three month sabbatical. The sabbatical is meant to provide (the priest/rector) a time for personal spiritual renewal, a renewed vision for the local church and academic pursuit in the hopes of enhancing his ministry in the local parish for years to come (which is my intention and hope). Alas, the burnout rate among Christian clergy is exceptionally high. The average stay in a local church is only three years. Thus, the sabbatical is also meant to be a time of spiritual healing, seeking Christian counseling (as well as enhanced spiritual direction and time with my confessor), prayerful reflection and R & R with their family. I will not be taking all three months of my sabbatical in 2019. I am saving two of the three months for writing my doctoral thesis at a time to be determined (hopefully in mid 2020 or early 2021). Please pray for me during this initial time of my sabbatical and please be assured of my daily prayers for you as my church family.

Thus, please note (in addition to my regular time off and other pastoral duties, etc. outside of HTAC):

- Tuesday, June 18 Thursday, July 18 Fr. Michael will be away on a one month sabbatical.
- Special Note: Fr. Michael will be present at HTAC on most Sundays during his sabbatical and throughout the 2019 summer!

I very much appreciate your prayers for me and my family this summer, especially when I am on sabbatical.

Update on our Postulants and Upcoming Ordinations in September 2019:

• Todd Murphy/Important Update: Todd recently received an offer to serve as Senior Pastor of a Congregation in Rhode Island. Sadly, the Congregation is not in communion with the larger Anglican family. The offer came unexpectedly (both to Todd, as well as to us) and came at a time when Todd's secular work was likely coming to an end as well (as the company he is presently working for has begun laying persons off and is likely to "fold"). Todd has accepted the offer. As a result he is sadly no longer a Postulant for Holy Orders in our Diocese or Province. We are grateful to Todd for his ministry and presence among us at HTAC, especially for his Sunday Noontime teaching on, "The Hebrew Names for God". We wish Todd and his wife Christine and their six boys God's blessing in his new ministry position.

• Dcn. Praveen Mutalik: Praveen was ordained a Deacon in Christ's holy Catholic Church a number of years ago through our Diocese (ANiC) and Province (ACNA). Sometime after his ordination, he began sensing a call to the Catholic Priesthood within the Anglican tradition. His discernment process has been lengthy. He has met a number of times with Bishop Charlie, our Diocesan Bishop; Bishop Harvey, our Bishop Emeritus; myself as both Archdeacon in New England and Rector of HTAC and our local discernment committee. Dcn. Praveen has an undergraduate degree and a Master's degree and is presently auditing Master level courses in theology through Cranmer House; a Seminary recognized by our Province (ACNA). He recently met with Bishop Harvey and myself. Upon our recommendation, Bishop Charlie is planning to ordain Praveen to the Sacred Order of Priests in Christ's holy Catholic Church at 11:00 a.m., Saturday, September 7; the Eve of the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. While "Fr. Praveen" will continue to serve at HTAC, he and I will be exploring other possibilities for him to serve as a priest and to reach the unchurched for Christ. Congratulations to Dcn. Praveen and Karen! Please keep them both in your prayers as Dcn. Praveen prepares to receive Ordination as a Priest in September.

Shawn Fowler: Many of you do not know Shawn. He and his wife Cate have been meeting with me on a regular basis over the past couple of years. They have been ministering, upon my request, with Wyldlife (middle school) and Young Life (high school) twice a month. Shawn also preached at HTAC on All Saints' Sunday during Solemn Choral Evensong last year. His sermon was well received. Shawn has met a couple of times with Bishop Charlie, our Diocesan Bishop; Bishop Harvey, our Bishop Emeritus; myself as both Archdeacon in New England and Rector of HTAC and once with our local discernment committee. Shawn will need to meet with the local discernment committee at HTAC three or four times in the coming months and complete some other parts of the ordination process. A bit about Shawn: Shawn has an undergraduate degree in Biblical Theology and Languages and will soon complete a Master's degree in Patristic Theology from Providence College, Rhode Island. He and his wife Cate, who herself has an undergraduate degree in Christian Youth Ministry, have taken my Anglican Studies Program on-line and have met with me for follow up discussion. Shawn recently met with Bishop Harvey and myself. Upon our recommendation, Bishop Charlie is planning to ordain Shawn to the Sacred Order of Deacons in Christ's holy Catholic Church at 11:00 a.m., Saturday, September 7. This assumes that all goes well with the local discernment committee, etc. Shawn and Cate will begin attending HTAC on a regular basis this June. Bishop Charlie has assigned Shawn to serve at HTAC for a period of two years (give or take) and to focus on Youth Ministry and Young Families (i.e., those in their 20's, 30's or 40's). Ultimately (assuming all goes well in the next couple of years), Shawn will be ordained to the Sacred Priesthood and move on from HTAC to plant his own congregation or to take a call to serve an established congregation within our Province and hopefully, our Diocese. Congratulations to Shawn and Cate! Please keep them in your prayers and be sure to welcome them to the HTAC family.


