I thank God and the members of our extended church family for the many ministries we offer during the summer months each year. *In all things, to God - and indeed to God alone - be all honour and glory!* While many churches are "ramping down" for the summer (some even closing), we at HTAC are "ramping up" to serve our Lord Jesus Christ and his people in new ways. For example: **1)** Our Summer Lunch Program (Monday through Friday): This ministry offers children in our local neighborhood a nutritious lunch throughout the summer (i.e., while they are out of the public school lunch program); **2)** Vacation Bible School (a joint venture with our dear friends at *The First United Methodist Church, Marlborough*): This ministry attempts to reach and introduce unchurched youth to Jesus Christ and His life-giving Word and to help others to grow - year by year - in their faith (*NOTE: I am blessed each year to offer a Bible Study with the VBS Teen Helpers enabling them to embrace more fully the wonder of God's holy Word and that Faith which he has revealed from heaven); **3)** The Saint Michael's Conference (a Christian Youth Conference in the "High Church Anglican Tradition", ages 14 through 21). This Conference enables youth to grow in the Biblical faith and order of Christ's holy Catholic Church throughout their high school and college years (I have served on the faculty of the SMC for 13+ years); **4)** Young Life Camp (introducing teens who do not know Christ Jesus or his holy Gospel to Christ Jesus and offering them Christian fellowship, etc.).

So very many members of our church family give sacrificially, day in and day out and/or week by week (according to their ability to serve) for the work of the Kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ. I simply want to say, "Thank you, thank you, thank you!!!" I am truly honoured to be your priest and to serve in this church family!

The above ministries are in addition to: June's Table (now feeding on average 30+ people every Saturday); Sunday morning Adult Christian Education; Wednesday morning Bible Study and Mass (resuming in the first week of August), etc.

I cannot articulate how very blessed I am to serve a church family that, in addition to the priority of Christian worship in the ancient and great tradition, is dedicated to serving the Lord both inside and outside the walls of the church!

Final Note: In every Season our wonderful Altar Guild, under the direction of Karen Mutalik, serves to augment our worship of Almighty God. Thank you, Karen and the many members of our HTAC Altar Guild!

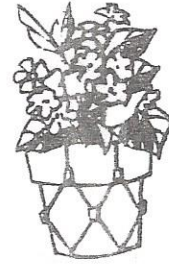

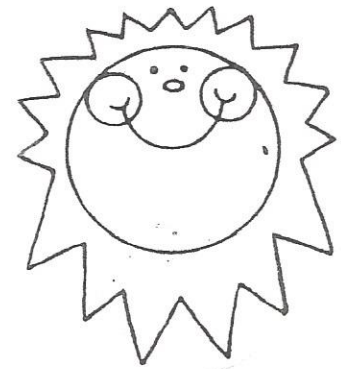

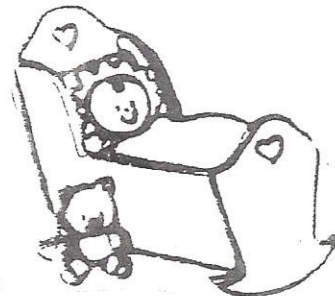
SUNDAY MORNING

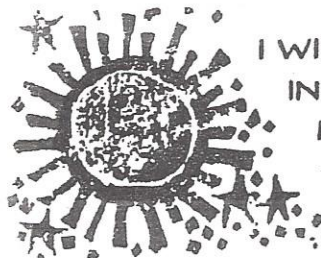

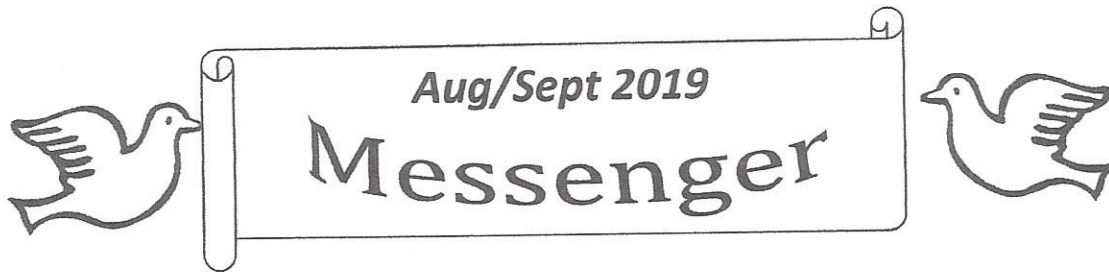
