Press Release (adapted): The pastors of four Marlborough churches are inviting all who are interested to a unity prayer gathering on Tuesday, October 22, 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. There will be four, fifteen-minute segments that will include a brief message, a worship song or hymn and time for prayer. Each segment will have a different focus. Fr. Michael will be leading one of the segments and will be inviting our choir to lead those gathered in a hymn.

Chad Braswell (Metro Church), Bailey Norman (Greater Grace Christian Fellowship), Father Michael McKinnon (Holy Trinity Anglican Church) and Logan Loveday (Hope Community Church) have been meeting together as part of a “Churches United” initiative to cultivate connections between each other and their church communities.

One of the guiding passages from Scripture for this effort comes from the Book of Philippians (1:27), “*Stand firm in the one Spirit, striving together as one for the faith of the gospel.*” The larger goal is to connect with other leaders who share a common faith and to bring the Body of Christ in Marlborough together, both in obedience to Scripture and to better serve the community.

“I am blessed to share fellowship with other pastors who submit to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and to the unchanging truth of the Holy Bible as God’s Word,” commented Father Michael. *“1 Thessalonians 2:13 comes to mind whenever we gather together, ‘And we also thank God constantly for this, that when you received the Word of God...you accepted it not as the word of men, but as what it really is, the word of God, which is at work in you believers.’ We are all looking forward to gathering in unity with others who share our faith and vision.”*

From our Rector & Priest:

My Dear Church Family and Friends of Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Marlborough, MA,

A few months ago a new votive candle station was placed in the rear of the nave of our church (on the Gospel-side of the church; i.e., on the left-hand side as one is exiting the church).

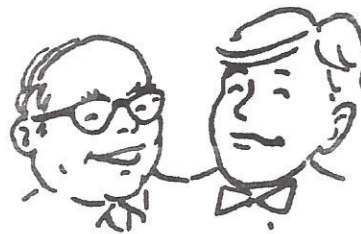
A few things to note:

- Firstly, lighting votive candles is a matter of personal piety (usually done prior to or following the Mass).
- This pious practice is required of no-one!
- This votive candle station is dedicated to Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, our only Mediator and Advocate (see, 1 Timothy 2:5), and Our Lady of Walsingham.
- There is an Anglican Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham in England. The Shrine is known as, "*England's Nazareth*". Bishop Harvey and I attended a Clergy Conference at the Shrine early this year.
- The Shrine includes a, "holy well". Throughout the centuries, many Christians have testified to God's healing grace and power communicated in and through these holy waters to the faithful.
- Waters from this holy well in Walsingham, England are being used at HTAC on special occasions (during the Asperges at the beginning of Mass) in the 2019 liturgical year.
- Our Dear Bishop, The Right Reverend Donald F. Harvey, our Diocesan Bishop (*retired*), has a personal testimony regarding the healing properties of these sacred waters.
- The (supposed) message of Walsingham is quite simple. It calls upon God's people to prayerfully contemplate the Biblical Mystery of our Lord's Incarnation; ie., God becoming man in the Person of Jesus Christ, "*for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven*". This message is at the very heart of our Christian Faith (Luke 1:26- 38; John 3:16-17; Philippians 2:5-11).
- PLEASE NOTE: Belief in such (supposed) apparitions are NOT required by anyone!
- Having said that, some Anglicans, while in prayer to Almighty God, beseech Him to bid the prayers of (for example) Mary, Our Lady of Walsingham, that she may pray with and for us before his heavenly Throne. Thus, the Saints of God are understood as prayer partners, praying with and for us to Almighty God.
- Lighting a Votive Candle: When Bishop Harvey and I were in England (including attending a Clergy Conference at The Anglican Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham), we lit votive candles on behalf of our (HTAC) church family. The lit candle represents our sincere desire that the saints and angels of God continue to offer our prayers before Almighty God long after we have left (please see, Revelation 8:3-4 and 5:8).
- My thanks to Fr. Praveen for his exceptional woodwork in creating this new votive candle station for those of us who wish to take part in such extra-liturgical devotions.
