"For I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes" (Romans 1:16a).

Are We The Perfect Church?

"I found the perfect Church," said no one, ever! All church families, like any family, have their issues (all sorts to be sure). I know our church family is not perfect. But I do love it (I love you!) How do I know our church family is not perfect? Because I, your priest and pastor, are part of it. Thus, it is not perfect. The Scripture is clear, we all fall short. *"For there is no distinction (that is, no one of us is any greater in the eyes of God than any other struggling person): For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified [ONLY] by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith" (Romans 3:22b-25a).* Simply put, it is not about us. It is not about what we have done or what we have failed to do. It is about him! That is, Christ Jesus our Lord and Saviour!

We have only to trust in Jesus. It is about what he has done for us by his incarnation, death and resurrection. We need only to trust in him (and no longer in ourselves) and to begin to walk by grace through faith in Christ Jesus. When we fall, and we will fall, we are called to repentance (that is, to turn around 180 degrees) and to walk anew by his grace. I love the fact that I don't need to trust in myself, or in my own strength or in anything in this world. I am called to trust only in God and his mercy! All of us - you and me - share two things in common: **1)** We are all fallen, broken, sinful people subject to the consequence of sin which is death (see Romans 6:23); **2)** By God's gracious mercy, we all have a divine dignity, worth and value bestowed upon us through Baptism (see Romans 6:3-9) and received and nourished in the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood (see 1 Corinthians 10:16; 11:23-32). Thus, we are not perfect, far from it.

For many of us, Christ Jesus is indeed our Saviour (I know he is my Saviour). However, we must also receive him more and more as our Lord (I humbly admit, this is something I work on more and more and day by day). How can we be more like Jesus and less like ourselves? Humility is the door. *"Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall" (Proverbs 16:18).* However, by God's good grace, as fallen and broken as we are, we are called to do great things in his Name (please see John 14:12). That is, we are called to love as we are loved by God (that is, unconditionally and apart from deservedness), to forgive as we are forgiven by God and to pray for our enemies, *"For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly...But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6,8).*

Anyone can love those who love them. Christians are called to love those who hate them, those who persecute them and those who drive them crazy! Where do we find the source of such love? We must go to the cross and look upon him whom we have pierced (see John 19:37). So the next time someone is driving you crazy, perhaps come to church a few minutes early and light a candle and say a prayer for them. Perhaps send them a card. I am often confronted by these words of Sacred Scripture (which appear in more than one place): *"God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble. Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you Draw near to God and He will draw near to you... Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up" (James 4:6b-8,10).*

"Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves" (Philippians 2:3). Thus, when we follow this example, we become living icons of Christ Jesus: "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:4-11).

I end with these words from the Psalm 115:1, *"Not to us, O LORD, not to us, but to thy name give glory, for the sake of thy steadfast love and thy faithfulness!"*

Holy Confession in Lent

The two Dominical Sacraments (i.e., holy Baptism and holy Eucharist) and the five Sacraments of the Church (i.e., Confirmation, Confession, Matrimony, Ordination and Anointing) are marked moments of God's presence, grace and healing. There are many good reasons to seek the assurance of pardon and absolution given in the Sacrament of Confession: there are times when we need marked moments of God's healing grace and power in our broken lives; times when we are in need of Godly counsel and direction from our priest; times when we need to unburden a troubled conscience; and of course, times when we have fallen into grievous and willful sin. Confession is a Sacrament of Healing, not judgment. It is an invitation for Christ to enter the deep places of our heart and to heal us. In Holy Confession, Christ comes to us as our Divine Physician, not as our Judge. By His grace, we are washed clean in His blood and restored to a right relationship with Him and His Church. Advent and Lent are particularly good times to seek the assurance of God's grace and forgiveness offered in Holy Confession. The Sacrament of Confession is available by appointment. Please call Father Michael or one of our other priests.

A Collect for St. Chad's Day (March 2nd):

Almighty God, whose servant Chad, for the peace of the Church, relinquished cheerfully the honors that had been thrust upon him, only to be rewarded with equal responsibility: Keep us, we pray thee, from thinking of ourselves more highly than we ought to think, and ready at all times to step aside for others, that the cause of Christ may be advanced; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

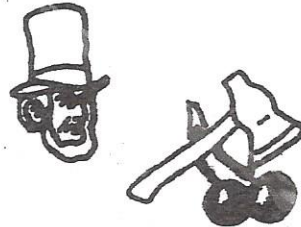
