We are truly living in interesting times. Many of us have never encountered anything like the present pandemic and we find ourselves with lots of questions about the role of God in such times as these. Where is God in our suffering? In Joshua 1:9 we read that God is with us wherever we go. In Zephaniah 3:17, we are assured that the Lord will quiet us with his love. We do not know how long this pandemic will last. What we do know is that God's love will last for ever (Psalm 136:1.) As we begin to resume our lives, we would do well to remember our blessings, to remember how God is working through his people and to ponder anew the depths of His love.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT & THOUGHTS ON ATTENDING WORSHIP

7:30 a.m. Sunday Said Mass (to begin Sunday, August 2):

Some members of our church family are at greater risk should they contract COVID 19. My daughter Sarah (due to asthma) and I (due to health issues) likely fall into this category. There are also some in our church family who are concerned about attending the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass due to larger numbers and for others wearing a mask for the length of the 10:00 a.m. Mass is difficult. Please know I understand and you have my support as your priest.

Having said the above, refraining from worship on the Lord's Day and from receiving the Blessed Sacrament (i.e., the Body and Blood of Christ Jesus) for an extended time is spiritually unhealthy and even dangerous for the Christian (apart from those who continue in grievous sin without repentance).

"Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled [asperges] clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together [i.e., for worship], as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near" (Hebrews 10:19-25; see also Hebrews 2:3).

[Jesus said] "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh"...So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink". (John 6:51, 53-55).

Therefore, if you fall into the categories above (e.g., high risk, a reasonable fear in attending the later Mass due to larger numbers, concerns regarding the length of the later Mass and wearing a mask, etc), please know that beginning Sunday, August 2 there is an alternative to the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass offered at HTAC. Beginning Sunday, August 2, we will be offering a Said Mass at 7:30 a.m. every Sunday. This Mass will be shorter (e.g., 45 minutes). Due to fewer numbers, individuals and families will be able to keep greater distances from others in the pews.

We are doing our very best to minister to all, while maintaining safety. Please be assured of my love and prayers in Christ Jesus our Lord and Saviour. I am hoping to see everyone when you are comfortable returning to Mass, soon.

JUNE'S TABLE

June's Table is continuing the take-out program for meals each Saturday. Presently, Holy Trinity is serving the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Saturday of the month. Greater Grace Fellowship serves the 4th Saturday; and the Rotary Club of Marlborough serves on the 5th Saturday. The students from the Advanced Math and Science Academy are currently on leave from June's Table, due to the Covid-19 closure of their school, so are not able to help with their usual 2nd Saturday meal.

We have three special needs at this time:

1) Volunteers to prepare the take-out food and deliver it warm, if appropriate, to the Outreach Center at 4:00 pm (HTAC is now supplying 60 meals, 3x/month)

2) Two additional volunteers each Saturday (in addition to Fr. Michael and Fr. Isaac), to package the take-out food, toiletries and food pantry items for distribution to our guests

3) Your continued help with the donation of items to the food pantry. (Please check the weekly HTAC enews for up-to-date needs.)

Thank you so much to those who have been cooking, donating to the June's Table pantry, and distributing all of these items!! Our French Hill neighbors are very grateful.

We have put in place recommended food safety and serving guidelines, to protect all involved. This outreach has become even more important to our guests, during the CoronaVirus outbreak. Bible Study: On Wednesday mornings at 10:00 a.m. Fr. Michael leads Bible Study via Zoom. At some point it will return to meeting in the Admin. Building, followed by a Said Mass. All welcome!

Noonday Prayer on Mondays: This will continue via Zoom. All are welcome. Following Noonday Prayer (which includes a hymn and a homily), we offer a time of free prayer for all who are able to join in.

GUIDELINES WHEN ATTENDING MASS:

"I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the LORD." - Psalm 122:1 (KJV)

Guidelines: Fr. Michael is asking all of us to submit to the guidelines outlined below. Let us do our very best to love one another and to help everyone feel comfortable when attending Mass on the Lord's Day. These guidelines will be relaxed in time. Please note that our guidelines take into account Federal, State and Diocesan guidelines and recommendations.

- Masks: People must wear a mask in order to attend Mass on Sunday mornings. A cloth mask is strongly recommended. If you forget your mask at home, one will be provided for you. Children ages 2 to 5 are not required to wear a mask. This decision is up to their parents/guardians. Children 2 and younger are not to wear a mask.
- Hand Sanitizer: People will be required to wash their hands thoroughly with hand sanitizer upon entering and leaving the church on Sunday mornings. Also, people will be required to wash their hands thoroughly with hand sanitizer before receiving the Blessed Sacrament/Holy Communion. We have installed several hand sanitizer stations throughout the church, including on the two front pews of the inner aisle for people to use just prior to receiving the Blessed Sacrament/Holy Communion. People may bring their own hand sanitizer as long as they wash their hands with it at the times appointed above. Hand sanitizer must contain at least 60% alcohol.
- Seating: Family members living in the same household may be seated together. All people, unless from the same household, must be seated at least six feet apart from the closest person. Every second pew will be open for seating.
- Social Distancing: Social distancing must be maintained at all times. People must stay at least six feet from one another, unless from the same household. The only exception to the six feet rule is when Fr. Michael is administering the Blessed Sacrament/Holy Communion to a person.
- Entering/Exiting the Church for Mass: All people are to enter and leave the church through the front doors. Please <u>DO NOT</u> use the side entrances. Clergy and Choir members must also enter and exit through the front doors of the church. <u>No</u> exceptions, please! At the end of Mass, people are asked to exit the church one pew at a time, beginning at the back of the church. Our HTAC Greeters will assist with this. The only exception to the above is the use of the elevator when necessary.
- Planning to Attend Mass: The Bishop is requiring that all people attending Mass on the Lord's Day
 have their attendance recorded (i.e., date and name). In the, hopefully unlikely, event that someone
 attending Mass on a Sunday contracts COVID 19, the people who attended Mass with them will be
 notified. This record will be destroyed after four weeks.
- Congregational Singing: The Cantor and Choir (limited to six people) will sing the hymn, service
 music, etc. People may follow along, but are asked to refrain from participating by voice (although not
 in heart). LIFT UP YOUR HEARTS!!!
- Receiving the Blessed Sacrament/Holy Communion: People desiring to receive the Blessed
 Sacrament/Holy Communion are required to wear a mask, lowering their mask only briefly to receive
 the Blessed Sacrament. People must wash their hands with sanitizer just prior to receiving the Blessed
 Sacrament/Holy Communion. People are to receive Holy Communion in the hand only. This is a
 temporary measure.

Using Zoom for our Church Meetings

Zoom, a videoconferencing service created for corporate webinars and meetings, has grown into something more amid the coronavirus outbreak. With the number of daily users exploding from 10 million to 200 million from December to March, it has become a forum for nearly every kind of social function, including happy hours, yoga sessions, school classes, and church services and meetings. We, at HTAC, use it for our Monday prayer gathering and Wednesday Bible study, as well as Parish Council meetings.

Because Zoom is so easy to use, it has also been easy for people to exploit the app to sow mischief or chaos. "Zoombombing" is when uninvited participants interrupt or derail a meeting. Sometimes it's harmless trolling, but often it rises to the level of harassment. If that happened to us, maybe the "bomber" would accidentally hear the Word of the Lord - who knows where that might lead.....

Here are some steps we can all take to make our meetings more secure:

- 1. Be careful about how you share meeting IDs. Don't post them publicly keep them to our mailing list.
- 2. Generating a new ID for every meeting would make sense
- 3. If a meeting gets "bombed" we will need to move to a second level of secure access, such as a waiting room or a password
- If you want to be extra careful, use Zoom only on a mobile device, such as an iPad or an Android phone, because these versions go through review in the app stores - less likely to get access to personal information
- 5. Using the Zoom application directly is safer than using Zoom in your browser open the app, enter the meeting ID, rather than clicking on the link

The reality is that, while you can't see and interact with your friends, your classmates and your church family, Zoom is one of the platforms people have adopted to replace these in-person interactions amid the coronavirus outbreak. And it works relatively well.

It's OK to use Zoom, experts say. Just be thoughtful about what you're using it for and observe a few precautions.
