COVID 19: Hardships and God's Blessings

The past several months have been exceptionally challenging to say the very least. No-one on this planet has been spared the effects of COVID 19. It is truly a global pandemic and very few aspects of our lives remain untouched.

- For a long time our Sunday worship was 100% on-line (my genuine thanks to Fr. Praveen for his ministry in live streaming the Mass and to Karen Mutalik for her ministry as Altar Guild Director). This was a very difficult time for us, especially as Anglican Christians (i.e., as Bible-Catholic Christians), who understand the presence of God in the gathering of the community (Gr: ecclesia), the proclamation of the Word within the assembly and the intimate fellowship (Gr: koinonia) of the Church and the sacramental life (Gr: anamnesis) of the Church. For us, worship is no ordinary thing, but a partaking in the worship of almighty God before his heavenly throne ("with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven"), a participation in God's story of salvation and so much more.
- Members of our church family contracted COVID 19 and we were all called to pray (and health permitting to fast) for them.
- So many of our ministries - and aspects of our life together as a church family - were placed on hold or were forced to radically change (e.g., June's Table).
- We were all, from some degree to another, separated from our family members, friends, neighbors and alas from one another as a church family.
- Some were all alone in isolation.
- We watched as 200,000 Americans died from COVID 19.
- We watched as politics divided and even tore apart America, families, friends, neighbors and yes, church families.

Personal Note: I have not seen some of you, members and friends of my beloved church family, for several months now. Please know just how important all of you are to me and how much I miss you. In 25 years of ordained ministry, I have never experienced such challenges. I long for the day when we will all be together again and can worship the Lord in the Mass on the Lord's Day and minister together to those in need (both inside and outside of our church family).

A Concern: Please do not allow this virus to rob you of your faith, your church family or our ministry together. Please do not allow it to shift your focus away from our Lord and His Word. Sixteen years ago (October 2004) my family and I were called here for a reason. You also are part of this church family for a reason. Together, we are called to make a difference. A pastor friend of mine recently said, "*Absence makes the human heart, by God's good grace, grow fonder, but too much absence alas, makes the human heart wander.*" We are a church family and we are called as a family to strive and work together in building up God's Kingdom in our church, our neighborhood, our city, our nation, our culture and in this world - a world that so desperately needs JESUS and the truth, love and mercy of his Word!

Thanks be to God, His Blessings never end (Even in the midst of COVID 19):

- We are once again meeting together to worship the Lord on the Lord's Day in the Mass (Sundays: 7:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.).
- My heart rejoices (actually leaps for joy) whenever I place the Blessed Sacrament into someone's hands.
- Everyone in our church family who has contracted COVID 19 has made it...Thanks be to God! (However, let us remember those outside our church family who have died in our prayers and ask God to bless and comfort those who mourn).
- In the midst of these crazy and unprecedented times we, at HTAC, are offering: Mass on the Lord's Day (both in person and on-line); Midday Prayer at 12 Noon on Mondays (on-line); Bible Study at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesdays (on-line); June's Table on Saturdays (receiving donations from 3:30 - 4:15 p.m. and serving the meal and so much more at 5:00 p.m.) and now Adult Christian Education on the Lord's Day at 2:00 p.m. (on-line).
- We may be a small church, but by God's grace we are doing BIG things in his Name. In all things, to God be the glory!
- We are also presently launching a new Women's Ministry (thank you Susan Thayer - you have put so much into this new ministry) and a new Youth Group Ministry known as M.A.C.O. ("*uh, oh...better get M.A.C.O.*" ☺; i.e., "Marked As Christ's Own"), as well as launching The Fellowship of the Sons and Daughters of Our Lady of Walsingham on Sunday, October 18.
- I am also involved in weekly ministry within our City/Community: The Marlborough Fire Department (as Chaplain); Churches United and The Marlborough Rotary Club. God is at work, not only within our church family, but within our City.
- I am also involved in weekly meetings with our Diocesan Bishop and other clergy of our Diocesan Family and I will soon begin offering an on-line Bible Study for high school and college age young adults (ages 14-21) as a member of the faculty of The Saint Michael's Conference (reaching the youth of North America with the Catholic Faith and Order of God's holy Word within the Anglican tradition).
- Please, my family, keep your heart's eye on Jesus Christ and on His holy Gospel. Politics has its place in our lives, but JESUS CHRIST IS OUR LIFE!
- It is important to note that our church family is called to be 100% about the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ! We take our mandate from God himself in the person of Jesus Christ in his Great Commission. "*And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age'.*" (Matthew 28:18-20).
- Our North American Province (ACNA), Diocese (ANiC), Archdeaconry in New England and Church Family (HTAC) do NOT endorse any particular candidate or political party. Our message is Jesus and his Gospel.
- Having said the above: Please prayerfully discern (and even fast) regarding your vote.

Let us love one another, respect one another, pray for one another and encourage one another. We are NOT called to judge one another, but to share the truth of God's Word in love and gentleness.

June's Table is continuing the take-out program for meals each Saturday. Presently, Holy Trinity is serving the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month. We are very happy to announce that The Advanced Math and Science Academy of Marlborough (AMSA) has resumed serving at June's Table on the 2nd Saturday of the month! Greater Grace Fellowship serves the 4th Saturday; and the Rotary Club of Marlborough serves on the 5th Saturday.

We have three special needs at this time:

- 1) Four volunteers to prepare the take-out food and deliver it warm, if appropriate, to the Outreach Center at 4:00 pm (HTAC is now supplying 60 meals, 2x/month)
- 2) One or two volunteers each Saturday (in addition to Fr. Michael and Fr. Isaac), to package the take-out food, toiletries and food pantry items for distribution to our guests

GUIDELINES WHEN ATTENDING MASS:

"I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the LORD." - Psalm 122:1 (KJV)

When attending Mass, please:

- Wear a mask. If you forget your mask at home, one will be provided for you.
- Use the hand sanitizer when entering church, and prior to receiving Communion.
- Unless from the same household, please sit six feet apart from the closest person. Pews are marked.
- Please use the front door when entering and exiting the church.
- Do not congregate in the church at the end of the service. Catch up with friends in the parking lot, keeping socially distanced.
- Your name will be recorded as you enter the church in case it is necessary to conduct contact tracing. This record will be destroyed after four weeks.
- There will be no congregational singing. The Cantor and Choir will sing the hymn, service music, etc. You may follow along, but are asked to refrain from participating by voice. *LIFT UP YOUR HEARTS!*

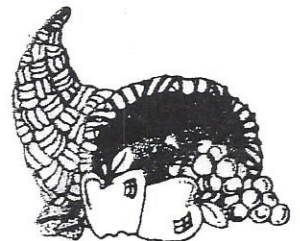

The Fellowship of the Sons and Daughters of Our Lady of Walsingham:

Bishop Harvey has given his approval to officially launch *The Fellowship of the Sons and Daughters of Our Lady of Walsingham* at the 10:00 a.m. Solemn High Mass on Sunday, October 18.

- The Feast of Our Lady of Walsingham is October 15.
- October 18 is the Feast of St. Luke the Physician who, most scholars believe, had The Blessed Virgin Mary as a source for his Gospel narrative. Ancient Christian tradition identifies St. Luke as the first Christian iconographer, writing an icon of Mary holding Jesus.
- October 18 also marks the 11th anniversary of HTAC officially being incorporated into the Diocese of the Anglican Network in Canada.
- Although Bishop Harvey will not be present on Sunday, October 18, he will be sending a letter to be read marking the importance of this occasion and congratulating our first members.
- Fr. Michael will be officiating on Bishop Harvey's behalf and will lead the first members of the Fellowship in making promises. He too will be making promises.

Pipe Organ Progress

If you have been able to attend church recently, you will have seen a Big Green Hut being set up in the parking lot. The structure is essentially complete as a shelter, just needs some adjusting to get the fabric properly tensioned. Next we will create a floor out of pallets inside, to keep all the organ components off the ground, as water running down the parking lot will flow through the building – it is temporary after all, no foundation. Anyone who wants to help with this step, please contact me.

After this is done, some tables will be put in, temporary lights arranged, then the big move will happen. The organ is presently housed in 58 crates, stored in two 20' containers at the old DPW yard on Route 85 in Marlborough. We will be commandeering every pick-up truck we can find, as well as every trailer for that exercise. Again, feel free to volunteer. Date will be announced.

Many thanks to the many volunteers (and even more volunteer supervisors) that have shown up to help - we've had some great teamwork, and very little blood.

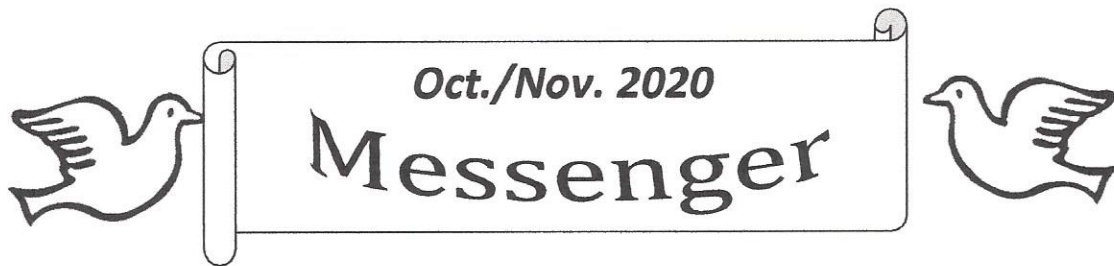
