# The Church as a Gathering of Believers

Having just celebrated Her birth on Pentecost Sunday, now is a fitting time to reflect on the nature of the Church as the gathering of God's people. In this age of fierce individualism, it is important that we not let our culture's emphases obscure what Holy Scripture clearly teaches concerning the nature of the Church. It is not uncommon to hear those around us claim to be "spiritual but not religious," that is, "believing in a higher power yet possessing a distaste for organized religion." One's personal connection to the Divine has come to replace, rather than complement, the communal relationship to both God and one another instituted by Jesus Christ himself. Even if you do not subscribe to the above statement, do remember that we all, if not on our guard, are susceptible to its pervasive sentiment. Added to the focus on the individual found generally in our society is the "new normal" implemented as a response to Covid-19, replete with Zoom meetings as replacements for almost everything previously conducted in-person.

The individualism of our democracy has combined with the "social distancing" of our current predicament to create an atmosphere in which many believers are content to keep themselves far from darkening the doors of their local church. Although understandable, doing so flies in the face of what our Lord Jesus Christ has revealed His Church to be: an in-person gathering of those who believe in Him, assembling with one another to worship and commune with the Risen Lord. Let us consider first what Jesus called this blessed entity: the Church. Our Lord chose the word "Ekklesia" as that which would signify his Church. This Greek word rendered literally from the original language means "a calling out." However, this "calling out" meant that people in ancient Greek-speaking towns and villages were "called out" of their homes in order to meet in the market or town square. Thus, the word means in English "assembly," "gathering," or "meeting." As this term was employed thousands of years before the advent of the internet, such a "gathering" would have been in-person. Jesus therefore called what we know as His "Church" His "Gathering." How can one be a part of His Gathering without actually gathering?

Lastly, let us consider the Apostle Paul's description of the Lord's Church as the "Body of Christ." In his teaching on spiritual gifts St. Paul reminds us that "just as the body is one and has many members, . . . so it is with Christ" (1 Cor 12:12). We are united in a manner akin to a body, each of us being an integral part of a whole that has our Lord Jesus Christ as head. Consider the life of a body that is missing just a part or two: can a person survive without a hand, or without an eye? Of course, but that body will not be functioning to its fullest. In the same way that the physical body operates at its highest capacity when all members are present and healthy, so the Body of Jesus Christ flourishes to Its utmost when all Christians called by His Name participate in the life of the Church. Further, consider the outcome of a part separated from the physical body. How does an ear, or a nose, fare when cut off from the rest of the body? Just as these wither and become lifeless, in like manner do our spirits suffer when we are severed from the life of the Body of Christ.

If you have received and believe in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, Holy Scripture says that you are a child of God and a member of the Body of Christ. Jesus is therefore calling you to gather together regularly with the other "parts" of His Body, so as to form that blessed gathering that is His Church, having Him as our Head. Although we were separated for a time due to circumstances out of our control, we have returned to a scenario in which meeting together in-person is a reasonable thing to do. Let us therefore throw off our tendency toward distance and isolation in order to embrace fully who God has created us to be: members of His Body assembled together to worship His Holy Name!



## HOMECOMING SUNDAY AND FAMILY PICNIC JUNE 6, 2021



Please note: There will be NO 7:30 a.m. Low Mass on June 6th.

All are invited to the 10:00 a.m. Solemn High Mass on this day and the church family picnic to follow. We will be giving thanks to Almighty God for His many blessings bestowed upon us during this worldwide pandemic and the gift of our Lord's Body and Blood; the Pledge of God's love and the Medicine of Immortality. No one has contracted COVID 19 by attending Mass at HTAC and every member of our church family who did contract the virus, has recovered. Thanks be to God! Additionally, God has used us in new and wonderful ways to minister to His people during this pandemic. There is so much for us to be thankful for!

# The following guidelines will be in place as of Sunday, June 6 (Homecoming Sunday):

We continue to follow Federal, State, and Diocesan guidelines regarding COVID 19. Each month Fr. Michael and the Parish Council will review these guidelines and if possible relax them. You will be kept updated.

#### In the Church:

- People are asked to continue to enter and exit the church for worship through the front doors or elevator. Please do not enter or exit the church for worship through the side or any other entrances.
- People are required to wear a mask inside the church at all times.
- People are required to sanitize their hands when entering the church.
- The Reader, if they have been fully vaccinated, may remove their mask when reading.
- The Gospeler, if they have been fully vaccinated, may remove their mask when proclaiming the Gospel.
- The Preacher, if they have been fully vaccinated, may remove their mask when preaching.
- People are required to sanitize their hands immediately prior to receiving Holy Communion.
- People will continue to receive Holy Communion one at a time; there will be two Communion stations.
- No-one, apart from the Presider, will receive the Consecrated Wine (i.e., the Blood of Christ) directly from the Chalice. Different Chalices will be used to communicate the people, the Blood of Christ being touched to the Body of Christ via a spoon.
- The Consecrated Bread (the Body of Christ) will be touched with the Consecrated Wine (the Blood of Christ) in order for people to receive both the Body and the Blood of Christ together.
- People seeking God's healing grace through anointing and prayer, will continue to be anointed by the clergy using a q-tip; the holy oil be applied on the forehead. These q-tips are burned afterward as the sacred oil is consecrated. The lay prayer ministers, serving under the direction of Dcn. Rhonda, may - if they are comfortable doing so - join in the prayers if: 1) they have been fully vaccinated and 2) the person being anointed and prayed for is comfortable with the lay prayer minister laying hands. Masks must be worn by all parties at this time.
- Fr. Michael will begin greeting people at the doors of the church following the Mass on Sunday, June 13. He has been fully vaccinated. @.
- People are asked to sanitize their hands when exiting the church, especially if they plan to shake hands or hug Fr. Michael.
- Fr. Michael will sanitize his hands after shaking anyone's hands. Thus, his hands may be a little wet with sanitizer.

#### However ...

- We will once again have full processions; e.g., Thurifer, Boat-bearer (incense), Cross-bearer, Torch-bearers, Icon-bearer, Cantor and Choir, Second Cross-bearer, Deacon of the Mass, Concelebrant, and Presider.
- People will be allowed to chant responses, join in the Psalm, and sing the hymn(s) at the time of the Offertory.
- Clergy assigned to serve, the Choir, and scheduled Altar Servers will be seated once again in the Chancel/Sanctuary.

### Coffee/Fellowship Hour:

- People are encouraged to stay for fellowship following the Mass.
- During the summer, refreshments will be simple: coffee, tea, water, juice, cookies, etc.
- Fellowship will be outside for now (during the summer months), except for inclement weather.
- When there is inclement weather, Fellowship will be held indoors. HOWEVER, if you are uneasy staying when Fellowship is held inside, please know that you need not stay. We will catch you next Sunday ③.
- When there is inclement weather, people are also welcome to go upstairs during Coffee/Fellowship Hour into Walker Hall if they like. Fr. Michael will do his best to greet everyone up and downstairs.

### **Church Family Picnic:**

- All food and drinks for the picnic will be purchased by the church. You need only bring yourself and a lawn chair if you are able to do so - and enjoy.
- A freewill offering is welcomed to help cover the costs, but not necessary.
- We have people who will serve the meats, salads, etc. They will have sanitized their hands and be wearing both gloves and masks while serving your food and drinks. If they do not put enough on your plate, just ask for more. ©
- There will be hand sanitizer on the serving table. Please sanitize your hands and wear a mask when receiving your food and drinks.
- Menu: BBQ meats (e.g. hotdogs, hamburgers, chicken), rolls, tossed dressed salad, macaroni salad, potato salad, baked beans, bags of chips, and dessert. We will also have bottles of water, both regular and diet cans of soda and coffee.
- Come and join in the fun and fellowship.


Christ the True Vine Anglican Mission
