

My Dear Church Family and Friends of Holy Trinity Anglican Church,

Grace and peace to you in Christ Jesus our Lord and Saviour!

Priorities (Part 1):

What are our priorities as an Anglican church family? This is an important question. The answer (In order):

- Divine Worship on the Lord's Day and during the week (an extension of which is bringing the Gospel and Sacraments to the sick and homebound)
- Evangelism
- Discipleship (for youth and adults)
- Local Outreach
- Global Mission

I will give a brief definition of each and identify some examples of how we are presently living out our priorities.

Divine Worship (briefly defined): HTAC seeks to embrace the mystery and awe of ancient Christian Worship for God's people today. "Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness; tremble before him, all the earth" (Psalm 96:9). The focus of our worship is God Himself. We seek God and His Kingdom, trusting that all that we need will be provided us. "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you" (Matthew 6:33). We believe that through worship the Christian community becomes partakers in the life of God, the incarnation of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and God's story of salvation. "His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire" (2 Peter 1:3-4).

Visiting the Sick and Homebound: This ministry is an extension of Divine Worship. When the clergy visit the sick and homebound bringing the Gospel and Sacraments, they are incorporating them into the Divine Worship of the Church. A quote from the Second Century (St. Justin Martyr; 150 AD): "...For all that we receive we bless the Maker of all things through his Son Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. And on the day which is called the Sun's Day [the Lord's Day] there is an assembly of all who live in the city, towns or the country; and the memoirs of the apostles and the writings of the prophets are read [the Readings], as much as time permits. When the reader has finished, the Celebrant gives a discourse [Sermon], admonishing us and exhorting us to imitate these excellent examples. Then we all rise together and offer prayer [Prayers of the People]; bread is brought and wine and water; and the Celebrant offers up prayers and thanksgiving [in Greek, "eucharist"] and the people assent with "Amen." Then follows the distribution of the Eucharistic gifts and the partaking of them by all; and they are sent to the absent by the hands of the deacons... We hold our common assembly on the Sun's Day because it is the first day on which God put to flight darkness and chaos and made the world; and on this day Jesus Christ our Saviour rose from the dead... He appeared to his Apostles and Disciples and taught them these things, which we have handed on to you" (Justin Martyr, 150 AD).

Divine Worship (examples): HTAC offers...

- 8:00 a.m. Said Mass on Sunday mornings
- 9:15 a.m. Morning Prayer (prayerful/meditative preparation for the 10:00 a.m. Mass)
- 10:00 a.m. Solemn High or Sung Mass (worship in the great tradition of the Church)
- Weekday Services (to resume soon)
- Regular visitation of the sick and homebound

Evangelism (briefly defined): Second only to Divine worship, evangelism is the greatest priority of the Christian. That is, we are all called to make Christ known and to share the Good News entrusted to us, especially when opportunity arises. "But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect..." (1 Peter 3:15). What is the Good News? Answer: When humanity fell out of right relationship with God and introduced sin into His creation, death began its reign. "For the wages of sin is death..." (Romans 6:23a). However, God did not abandon us to sin and death, but rather sent His only and eternal Son Jesus Christ into the world, that all who believe in Him (i.e., trusting no longer in themselves - the desires of the flesh, the ways of the world, or the deceits of the Devil, but in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for their life and salvation) will be delivered from sin and death, be saved, and become children of God by grace and heirs of God's Kingdom. "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23). The very love God the Father has for His Son from all eternity, He pours out upon us who are His children by adoption and grace. "For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him" (Romans 8:14-17).

Evangelism (examples): HTAC offers...

- The Gospel, the Good News of Jesus, proclaimed both inside and outside Divine Worship.
- Our evangelism is connected to our worship, discipleship, outreach, mission, etc.
- Prayer Walks (This was once a prominent form of evangelism in our church family). Once a week we would walk through our greater neighborhood; greet our neighbors; offer them a gift bag with a bible, loaf of homemade bread, coffee mug, candle, and much more; and anoint and pray with people if they were open to it). 
