Dear Members and Friends of Holy Trinity Anglican Church,

It is my honor and joy to fill in for Fr. Michael during his sabbatical and to step into the role of Interim Rector upon his departure in September of this year. I give thanks to God for all that He has accomplished in Marlborough through the ministry of our Archdeacon. Additionally, I am grateful to have learned so much from him both liturgically and pastorally. Although the prospect of Fr. Michael moving on causes us great sadness, we can take solace in the certainty of God's plan for our congregation. God is not done with Holy Trinity Anglican Church! We will continue worshiping our Triune God with the fullest of liturgical expressions and will persist in bringing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the French Hill neighborhood and beyond.

On the topic of evangelism, I am excited to announce a new ministry that will begin shortly on the church property. In mid June, we will start a "sidewalk Sunday school" that will take place in the parking lot twice a month on Saturdays. It will be offered to children ages 4 to 14, including those who attend our church, but especially for the kids of our neighborhood. We will make a special effort to invite those families that live in houses directly adjacent to the parking lot. This ministry will offer music, games, food, and a Bible teaching. The children present will hear the Gospel proclaimed, but volunteers will also take care to reach out in love to the parents dropping off and picking up their kids; our aim is to build relationships with entire family units, Eventually inviting them into the life of our church. Please pray for this important ministry! Also, please keep our church family in prayer during this time of transition.

From the Rector's Warden:

As we all know by now, our dear Fr. Michael and family will be leaving Holy Trinity at the end of August. They will continue God's work by planting a new church in North Carolina. While we are very sad to be losing Fr. Michael, Christine, Sarah and Rebecca, we understand it is important for them to go where called. I, and others, will have more to say about our wonderful Rector Fr. Michael as the time approaches for him to leave.

For now, I urge everyone to allow Fr. Michael his Sabbatical time that was arranged prior to his being called elsewhere. This is the first "real" sabbatical Fr. Michael has been able to take over his almost 18 years here.

- Fr. Michael will be on Sabbatical from Monday, April 25 Friday, June 17.
- Fr. Michael will be on Vacation, Conference Leave, and Continuing Education Leave from Tuesday, June 28 - Friday, August 13. Fr. Michael will be present at Holy Trinity on Sunday, August 14 and Sunday,
- During Fr. Michael's Sabbatical, Fr. Shawn is present three days a week at HTAC (Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays). The other clergy are also available to the best of their availability.
- While Fr. Michael is away, subject only to the Bishop, the Rector's Warden, in consultation with the People's Warden, is in charge of the temporal affairs of the church. In the event of an emergency, the Rector's Warden will contact Fr. Michael.
- Fr. Shawn, working together with the Wardens, will notify the Diocesan Bishop of any pastoral or fiscal issues which need his attention.
- Fr. Michael's final Mass at Holy Trinity will be Saturday, August 27 at 4:00 p.m. followed by a special Reception at Marlborough Country Club at 6:00 p.m. (More on that below.)

By now everyone should have received (or heard) Fr. Michael's letter to the Parish and also Bishop Charlie's letter. Excerpts from those letters are reprinted below. If you would like the complete letter mailed to you, please let me know.

Excerpts from Fr. Michael's announcement sent to Holy Trinity Church family May 10, 2002:

"My Dear Church Family and Friends of HTAC, Marlborough, MA,

"It is with sadness, yet with a sure conviction that I am following the Lord's call on my ministry, that I write to inform you that I/we will soon be taking our leave from HTAC, Marlborough, MA.... Following months of prayerful discernment I have accepted a call to serve our Lord as a church planter..... planting a new church in North Carolina..... I will be starting a church from scratch: no people, no building, no money, etc. I have only a strong conviction that the Lord Jesus has called me to launch a church in this region and the knowledge that many of you will be holding me/us up in your daily prayers.....

- "Our church family and our sister congregation ASAC, Rutland, VT hold a very special place in my heart. No matter where I serve, you will always be with me. I love you all!
- I will be at HTAC on Sunday, June 19 with Bishop Harvey as we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi together and later that day in Rutland, VT at ASAC.
- I will also be at HTAC on Sunday, June 26 with Bishop Charlie (our Diocesan Bishop); Bishop Harvey (our Bishop Emeritus); and Bishop Dan Gifford, our Bishop Coadjutor and the future Diocesan Bishop of ANiC as of Synod this November.

 I will be present at HTAC on Sunday, August 14 and again on Sunday, August 21. [Fr. Michael's last Mass at HTAC will be Saturday, August 27.]

"I will be ordained for 27 years this July 9. Of those 27 years, it has been the greatest part and honour of my ministry to serve you for the past 18 years as your priest and pastor.

Excerpts from the letter read to and sent to the Parish from our Diocesan Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Charles "Charlie" Masters:

"My dear friends of Holy Trinity Anglican Church Marlborough, Clergy, Wardens and People of the Parish,

"... By now you will have all heard that your/our beloved Rector, Archdeacon Michael McKinnon has accepted an invitation by the Bishop of the Diocese of the Living Word, another diocese of the ACNA, to plant a new church in an area of great growth in North Carolina. I am sure we are all sad at the thought of not seeing and being with Fr. Michael weekly and having him lead as the pastor, priest and Rector of Holy Trinity Marlborough as well as being the Regional Archdeacon.

"I want to assure you that throughout the time and months when this possibility was being developed, Fr. Michael conferred with me all along and I have been giving my blessing both to consider this and now to accept the invitation. I will of course formally be assuring Bishop Julian Dobbs of my blessing as Fr. Michael continues soon now as a Church planter in the Diocese of the Living Word.

"Though we are all sad at this development and will miss him and his family, it is clear to me and I expect to you as well, that there are few people better suited as pioneers to be called upon by God to start, out of nothing, a new church. I believe in God that this new congregation will be a powerful platform of worship and witness for many many people for many years ahead... So as Bishop, and you as the people of Holy Trinity Marlborough I encourage us all to... bless Fr. Michael and family as they will move at the end of August and thank God for the amazing and important years that we were able to enjoy his/their ministry in our midst.

"I am grateful that Bishop Dan, Judy and I can look forward to being with you in June as well as Bishop Don and at that time we will have an opportunity face-to-face to ponder what the future might look like with your Wardens, Clergy and Congregation. It is wonderful that our Coadjutor Bishop Dan will be with us. He of course will become our Bishop at Synod at the beginning of November and so I have tried to keep him informed as things have developed and he has given his blessing to these things as well.

"... I'm grateful that Fr. Shawn is giving coverage as leader during Fr. Michael's sabbatical. I have asked him and he has accepted my assignment to continue as Priest in Charge pro Tem after Fr. Michael has moved. While I and Bishop Dan will be with you, we will have an opportunity to discuss these things with him and the Wardens and for us to explain to all what Priest in Charge Pro Tem (or Interim Rector) actually means and how that may work in the short term and longer term but for now you can know that everything is in place and that the life and work of Holy Trinity will go forward exactly as Archdeacon Michael would have expected and wanted it to go.

"Most important in all this is for us to remember the words of Paul 'He who calls us is faithful and He will surely do it.' Today, as always, we put our trust in God and rejoice in what He has done in the past, is doing right now, and will most surely do in the future, for us, for the McKinnon family, and for the work of Holy Trinity church. We can be confident that the Lord, who is calling is going to bless the work of the church both in Marlborough and in the community that Archdeacon Michael will soon be serving in.


