Beloved Church family,

Summer greetings to you!

As we approach our Church's change in leadership that takes place in September, I am reminded of Bishop Charlie's address to us in Boothbay Harbor this past June. He looked at how St. Paul trained Timothy for his upcoming departure, examining those points the Apostle emphasized for such a situation. I too think that St. Paul's address to Timothy is instructive for our current context, and I am reminded of what he says in 2 Timothy 3, beginning in the 14th verse:

"But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

Although our situation isn't exactly the same, I believe that it is also imperative for us to hold fast to the faith and tradition handed down to us during this time. Let us honor Fr. Michael and his labor in this parish by continuing to pursue our risen Lord, especially the revelation of Him graciously given us by the Father in the Holy Scriptures. Please take some time to meditate on what the above biblical passage teaches us about God's Holy Word, and consider how you might be "trained in righteousness" through it.

THE FOLLOWING WAS SENT OUT BY EMAIL RECENTLY REGARDING WHAT TO KNOW WHEN FR. MICHAEL LEAVES HOLY TRINITY:

Protocol:

It is protocol for a departing Rector not to have contact with members of his previous church family for a specified period of time. This is particularly important following a long tenure.

The Right Reverend Charles "Charlie" F. Masters, our Diocesan Bishop, has asked Fr. Michael to employ

the above protocol.

- Why? This period of time allows the pastoral relationship between the new priest and the church family to take root and begin to solidify and for the former Rector to focus on his new calling and his family in their time of transition.
- There are a few exceptions (please see below).

Beginning Sunday, August 28:

Fr. Michael will be discontinuing his present cell phone service. Therefore, the number 508-330-2179 will no longer be operational.

Fr. Michael will be discontinuing both his current email addresses.

Therefore, Bible.Catholic.7@gmail.com and Fr.Michael.HTAC@gmail.com will no longer be operational.

Fr. Michael is asking that people please not message him via Facebook during this time period. If someone does, he will not be able to respond. Also, he will likely suspend his Facebook account for a period of time.

The McKinnons will be establishing a temporary PO Box address for people to send holiday and birthday cards if they wish.

Sometime in the early New Year (e.g., February or March 2023), Fr. Shawn will publish Fr. Michael's new home address and cell phone number.

In the event of an emergency (during this initial time period):

- Upon request of a person or a family member, Fr. Shawn will contact Fr. Michael should someone in the HTAC family need prayer due to serious illness or in the event of a death. Especially in the latter case, Fr. Michael will likely be in contact with the family.
- Upon request, Fr. Shawn will communicate to the HTAC Church Family any serious prayer request due to illness or death that takes place in the McKinnon Family.

Special Services, Funerals, Weddings, Etc:

Should a person or family desire for Fr. Michael to preside and/or preach at a Special Service (e.g., renewal of Marriage Vows, Funerals, or Weddings), they should contact Fr. Shawn and ask him to invite Fr. Michael to participate. Fr. Michael can only participate in Services at HTAC upon invitation of the present Priest-in-Charge or future Rector.

Exceptions:

- Required research for Fr. Michael's Doctoral Studies includes him leading a mini-course via Zoom with certain people who have been regular attendees of his Bible Study classes. Fr. Shawn, soon to be Priest-in-Charge Pro Tem at HTAC, has granted permission for this course to take place. The course has a requirement of interviews with participants both prior to and following the course.
- Fr. Michael plans to attend the ANiC Diocesan Synod in early November in order to honour Bishop Charlie as he steps down as our Diocesan Bishop after many years of faithful service and to honour his good friend Bishop Dan in becoming ANiC's new Diocesan Bishop.

Request from Fr. Michael:

My Dear Church Family and Friends of Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Marlborough, MA: I am so blessed to be your priest and to have served you for almost 18 years. I have one departing request. Please support Fr. Shawn in his new ministry as Priest-in-Charge Pro Tem at HTAC. He brings many gifts to HTAC and I am grateful to God for the time that he and I shared ministry together. I ask that you all offer him the same love, support, prayer, respect, etc. that you have shown me over these many years. Please encourage him where he is doing well and support him in his struggles. Please pray for him and his family daily. Thank you for supporting Fr. Shawn.

Lastly, I am grateful to God for my clergy serving at HTAC and I know they will do all that they can to support Fr. Shawn in his new ministry. We, as a church family, have been genuinely blessed by our clergy.

All Saints' Anglican Church, Rutland, VT (ASAC)

As many of you know, HTAC, Marlborough, MA helped launch a church plant in Rutland, VT; approximately 16 years ago. I was present for their very first meeting. The church plant grew and eventually was acknowledged as a Parish of our Archdeaconry and Diocese.

This church family has faced many challenges over the years. This includes the unexpected death of their beloved Rector, Fr. Andrew Carlson, less than a year ago. Fr. Andrew was/is highly respected by the members of ASAC. They love him very much. Since his death, the clergy of HTAC have stepped up and given sacrificially of their love, time, and ministry to assist the ASAC family during their time of grief. As their Archdeacon, I can say that I am genuinely blessed by the support that our clergy offered to our sister Parish.

A Special Shout Out: I am exceptionally grateful to Fr. Isaac Fisher. Fr. Isaac retired from teaching this June after decades of service to children with special needs. His plans were to retire and move to the deep south where he would care for his mother and be near other family. However, upon my request as his Archdeacon, he soon altered his plans and was willing to move to VT for a minimum of two years to minister and grow ASAC. However, in the past few months, several changes came about in ASAC. A family was required by their work to relocate to the Midwest. Two other prominent families also plan to relocate, one due to work and the other couple due to retirement. Another couple spends half the year in Florida. This led to the members needing to make some serious decisions about their future.

On Sunday, July 10 the ASAC family voted unanimously to close their doors ②. Bishop Harvey and I recently visited with them to offer guidance and to pray over their decision. With much sadness, and with deep appreciation for their faithfulness over these many years, Bishop Charlie, our Diocesan Bishop, received and approved their decision.

 During Fr. Michael's Sabbatical, Fr. Shawn is present three days a week at HTAC (Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays). The other clergy are also available to the best of their availability.

• While Fr. Michael is away, subject only to the Bishop, the Rector's Warden, in consultation with the People's Warden, is in charge of the temporal affairs of the church. In the event of an emergency, the Rector's Warden will contact Fr. Michael.

 Fr. Shawn, working together with the Wardens, will notify the Diocesan Bishop of any pastoral or fiscal issues which need his attention.

• Fr. Michael's final Mass at Holy Trinity will be Saturday, August 27 at 4:00 p.m. followed by a special Reception at Marlborough Country Club at 6:00 p.m.
