

From our Interim Rector:

Beloved Church family: as we enter into the Fall and return to our usual routines, I am reminded of our ever-present need to evaluate those routines--and by extension--our lives. Even as Christians it is all too easy to "go with the flow" of the culture around us, not taking the time to stop and examine how the things we are doing affect our walk with Christ. Let us therefore stop and ask ourselves the following: Is the life we are living 1) drawing us closer to God; and is it 2) growing our love for others?

On this topic let us also consider what the Apostle Paul says to the Church in Corinth. After describing how he becomes "all things to all men" in order to reach them with the Gospel, he states: "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified" (1 Cor. 9:24-7).

The Bible exhorts us not to traverse the roads of life "aimlessly," simply following the path flattened by the crowds while sprinkling in some "Christian" elements like "doing good things" and "showing up to church"; rather, we are *intentionally* to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, carefully thinking through all aspects of our lives and holding them up against the standard of God's Word. Do not waste one more moment of your life running this race haphazardly. Fix your gaze on the goal: Christlikeness. Fill your days with things that will draw you closer to Him; reject those things that lead you away from Him. Do this for yourself, and if you have young children, make the tough decisions necessary to guide your entire family in this direction. Do not be flippant about the state of your own soul, or concerning your children's walk with God. Treat this matter as it actually is: the most important race you will ever run.




