

Beloved Church Family,

Happy New Year! As we enter into Advent 2022 and look forward the Holy Days and Seasons instituted by the Church, let us give thanks to God that He, through His Body, has given us a means by which to put Him first throughout all the days of our life. Remember that one of the biggest dangers in this life is to forget about the God who made us, loves us, and saves us. It seems preposterous that God's people might forget Him, but that is exactly what has happened throughout history (Deut 32:18; Jdg 3:7; Psa 106:21, etc.), and sadly takes place among Christians today. Seeing this problem in advance, throughout Scripture the Lord calls on His people to take actions that will help remind them of their God: after crossing the Jordan, the Israelites were commanded to set up twelve large stones on the bank of the river so that when they walked by it in the future, their children would ask about it, and they would recount their deliverance from Egypt (Jos 4:1-9); the Lord directed His people to live as though His written Word was in a container dangling in front of their eyes (Deut 6:8), so that everything they did was with God's commands in view.

This pattern of encouragement continued in the ministry of our Savior, as Jesus instituted both Baptism and the Eucharist. Although we as a congregation cherish the fact that these two ordinances are indeed Sacraments, and that through them God transmits His grace to the recipients, it is also true that they are memorials. That is, these Sacraments also serve as ways of remembering the Lord, as safeguards against forgetting our Master. By participating in these Mysteries, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is brought before us, and we are received into His loving embrace--and all this is to happen on a continual basis.

Thankfully, the Church also has implemented a means by which we remember and give thanks to God on a yearly, seasonal, and even daily basis: the Church Calendar. Throughout the centuries the Body of Christ developed a structure for ordering time, a structure that has the worship of God as its focal point. Beginning with the cycle of Christ's birth, we enter first into Advent, just four weeks before the Holy Day and Season of Christmas. After Christmas is Epiphany, which then leads us into the Paschal Cycle: starting with Lent, the Church approaches Holy Week, culminating in the celebration of our Lord's Resurrection in Easter. Like Christmas, Easter is both a Holy Day and Season, and the Easter Season is followed by Pentecost Sunday, then by what we call "Ordinary" time. Even that which is ordinary is filled with numerous Holy Days by which we commemorate significant Holy people and events belonging to the history of the Christian Faith.

The marking of time is a critical aspect of the human life. It is one that we don't often think about, but it is important nonetheless. Our secular society has a way of marking time to which we are subject. Some of this is noble, such as celebrating the Independence of our nation on July 4th, or the lives of

praiseworthy individuals such as Martin Luther King Jr. on the third Monday of January. However, a good deal of it issues from large companies' commercial interests, or simply from motives that aren't aligned with God's desires for us. As a result, after Thanksgiving, rather than embracing Advent and preparing ourselves in penitential manner to encounter Christ at Christmas, our society enters directly into the "Christmas" season, replete with all the feasting and celebration that should begin on 12/24 and 12/25, rather than there ending. By the evening of 12/25, "Christmas" is over, and especially by the New Year, we have moved on to perusing the aisles of stores whose shelves proudly display Valentine's Day items. That is to say nothing of our culture's insistence on consigning Christ to the shadows of Christmas obscurity while assigning perhaps the most exciting feature of the holiday, presents, to a fictitious figure whose legend has been stripped of its original ties to the Christian faith.

Brothers and sisters, let me reiterate that the marking of time is vitally important to human society and to us as individuals. We, as Christians, unfortunately have the habit of mindlessly following the patterns of our godless culture when it comes to the celebration of seasons, holidays, and even Holy Days of the Christian Faith. We follow this course of action, coupled with a general disregard for the call of Christ on our lives, and then marvel as we find ourselves adrift from the Lord and our children come of age only to abandon the Faith entrusted to them. We cannot follow in the footsteps of this world and expect to arrive at the threshold of the "narrow gate" (Mt 7:13). Rather, let us pick up our cross daily and follow Jesus (Lk 9:23), embracing a lifestyle that continually reminds us of Him. This Advent, welcome into your family the traditional celebration that arose in the life of the Church. Fast, pray, and seek God in his Word. Turn from your sins. Employ an Advent Calendar, meditating especially on the Old Testament prophecies that speak of the Christ's Coming. Listen to Christian Hymns of Advent, singing of the Lord's first and future Parousiai, and the ministry of the Forerunner, John the Baptist. Overall, take these next few weeks to prepare yourself, so that at month's end, your heart, filled with love, might enthrone Him.



THE GIFT OF CHRIST'S COMING

"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God with us." Matthew 1:23

Centuries before Christ was born, the prophet Isaiah foretold about His coming. At Christmas we read the amazing prophecy about the virgin who would conceive and bear a Son.

Isaiah 11: 2, prophesies that the Spirit of God would rest upon the coming Messiah – giving us a wonderful picture of Jesus. "The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord."

It's incredible to think that the Spirit who rests upon Jesus is given to everyone who follows Him! As our God promised in Joel 2:28 "I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh." His Holy Spirit abides in us, and in Hebrews 13:5, declares, For He has said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation."

This is the prophetic account of Jesus at the Water Festival. Every year, people would draw water from the pool of Siloam, bring it to the Temple Mount, pour it out at the altar, and say, "Let us draw water from the wells of salvation."

John 7: 37-39, this records when Jesus cried out at the last day of the Festival of Booths. "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water." This He said concerning the Spirit whom those believing in Him would receive.

As we celebrate Christmas, remember Jesus is our salvation. If you are sick in body, discouraged, or just overwhelmed, Jesus said, "Come and drink." Spend time with Him and trust Him.

Let us welcome Sweet Little Jesus Boy who will save all who believe in Him!




