

Dear Church Family,

As we come to the end of Epiphany and prepare for Lent, may we take this time to ready ourselves for the encounter of God. From time to time in Scripture are recorded preparatory events for God's people, and even for Jesus Himself. Most notable for Lent is that 40 day period that our Lord spent in the desert fasting as He prepared to begin His public ministry. This 40 day sojourn purposefully mirrored the 40 years of wandering that the Israelites endured in the wilderness, which served as a preparation for them to enter the Promised Land.

God's original plan after delivering them out of Pharoah's grasp was to take them straight to the land of Canaan over several days. However, tempted by the non-ideal conditions in the desert and the prospect of battling larger-than-expected enemy nations, the Israelites gave into fear and grumbled against Moses and the Lord. God then decided to purify the Israelites by causing them to wander in that wilderness for decades until all the unbelievers died off. Only those who were faithful originally or were children during that rebellion would step foot into the Promised Land. Although God's covenant son, Israel, failed to walk in faith when faced with earthly fears, fortunately for us—and all mankind—God's only begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, thoroughly trounced Satan and his temptations.

Looking at these temptations and Jesus' responses will be helpful for us, as we prepare ourselves for the self-denial to which the Christian life calls us, especially during Lent. Three temptations are suggested. The first deals with the physical needs of the body, and a challenge to one's pride. That is, Satan says to Jesus, after he has fasted for weeks and is therefore weak with hunger: "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become bread" (Mt. 4:3). Note that physical weakness can also lead to spiritual weakness, if we aren't careful to guard against it. The enemy will exploit such situations, just as when the Israelites were in the desert. Although in slavery, in their minds they had eaten well in Egypt. Once in the wilderness, they immediately began to fear that they would starve. After experiencing just a little hunger, they allowed that physical deprivation to empty them of their faith as well, and in turn sinned greatly against the Lord. Jesus, on the other hand, did not allow physical discomfort to lead him into sin. Rather, he replied to Satan's suggestion with Scripture: "It is written, man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Mt. 4:4). The Word is spiritual food, and having our spirits sustained is even more important than the needs of the physical body. Jesus elsewhere said that "it is better for one to enter into life crippled or lame" than with one's whole body intact to be cast into the fires of hell (Mt. 18:8).

We will also look briefly at the third temptation. Satan said, "All these [The kingdom of the earth] I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me" (Mt. 4:9). Having failed with his first two attempts, which appealed to the bodily appetites and pride, Satan lastly tries to arouse a thirst for power. He would have known that Jesus had come to reclaim the nations of the world from him, and here he was trying to offer the proverbial "get rich quick" scheme. Jesus could accomplish his entire mission (at least the part of it to which Satan was privy) in an instant, avoiding all the difficulties that were to come. However, that was not God's way; and also, anyone with just a touch of life experience knows that temptation boasts of great things, but fails to deliver. May Jesus' response be indelibly etched into our minds: He does not consider the offer, contemplate the possibilities, or try to reason through the matter. He instead rejects it outright, responding with what the Word of God says about the situation: "Be gone Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only shall you serve" (4:10).

Beloved friends, this Lent may we meditate upon both the Israelites and our Savior Jesus Christ as they were in the wilderness. Let their examples serve as instruction for us in the present day. May the Old Testament narrative provide a cautionary tale on not allowing earthly circumstances, including ailments and deprivations of the physical body, to draw us away from the obedience of faith (Rom. 1:5; 16:26); may Jesus' example become a model for our own discipleship, resulting in the prioritization of God's will over our own complaints and demands. Lastly, may we respond swiftly to temptation with the truths of Scripture, turning away from dead works and running into the loving embrace of Christ our Lord. Amen.


