#### God Adopts Us

This late summer season, I find my mind drawn to God's adoption of us through His Spirit, and it is drawn there for two reasons: the first is that—thanks be to God!—all legal hurdles have been overcome, and we will very soon be adopting our girls! The second comes from our current sermon series; I have been preaching through the New Testament lessons as of late, and we're presently in Romans 8. The very next verses whence we left off have to do with God's adoption of us through His Spirit. Let's take a look, and may God cause His Word to take root in us as we do.

The Apostle Paul just finished telling us that the same exact Spirit that raised the Lord Jesus from the dead 2,000 years ago is at present residing within us, if we are in Christ. So, are you His? Do you belong to Christ? Is He your Lord and Savior? If so, the Holy Spirit, who brought up again Christ from the dead, is within you right now. But that's not the end of the statement: he then tells us that just as the Holy Spirit raised Jesus from the dead, the Spirit will also "give life to" our "mortal bodies." He had just finished saying that our "body is dead because of sin." Therefore, the spiritual deadness that comes from walking in the flesh and living for sin will be reversed by the power of God, in a manner similar to how he raised Jesus up from the grave. Thanks be to God! Further, please note that he is talking about a present newness of life, not about your resurrection on the Last Day. What a promise! May we walk in the faith that God will fulfill this word in our lives here and now.

Next, the Apostle writes this:

12 So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. 13 For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. 14 For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. 15 For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" 16 The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, 17 and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

- Romans 8:12-17

In addition to the Spirit empowering us to grow in holiness, He is also called here the "Spirit of Adoption." This is contrasted with "spirit of slavery," which refers back to chapter 6, in which we are told that prior to our salvation in Christ, we were "slaves of sin." Therefore, rather than the Spirit causing us to backslide into sin-slavery, He instead is the means by which we *know* that we are children of God. Remember that Jesus is the Son of God by nature; we are not that, yet still the Bible

calls those who trust in Christ "children of God" (Jn 1:12-13) In what way? We are children by grace and adoption! The Father puts His very own Spirit within us to mark us as His own and as a "down payment" of our redemption (Eph. 1:13-14). The promised Holy Spirit is a pledge that God will faithfully complete the work of salvation that He started. The Spirit within us, as the Apostle states above, "bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God." The preposition in this sentence can also be translated "to"; that is, the Spirit testifies "to" our spirit that we are children of God. This is a better understanding of what St. Paul means here. The Holy Spirit tells our own spirit, the innermost aspect of our being, that we are God's children. We have not been rejected or forsaken! On the contrary, we have been chosen! We are not alone in this life, for God, who has graciously adopted us, has given us of His own Spirit to abide with us forever. The giving of His Spirit completes the adoption. We aren't just servants; we are sons and daughters. The inner revelation of this truth is so great that, at times, it even manifests in us crying out "Abba! Father!" (Rom. 8:15). What a privilege and a joy to know with certainty that God is our Father, and that He is a good Father who delights in giving good gifts to His children (Mt. 7:7-11).

Perhaps this area is a struggle for you. Perhaps you wonder whether you really are God's child, or whether the Lord has actually saved you. I encourage you to take God at His Word, stated above; further, His Word indicates that His children will experience what is described therein. Please meditate on this passage from Romans 8. Read it slowly, prayerfully, and repeatedly. Ask God to allow you to know by experience what is written there by the Apostle. This same Father who delights in giving His adopted children good gifts, also gives the following promise through His Son by nature: "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you" (Mt. 7:7). May your Father bless you with knowledge of His timeless, ineffable truths as you explore His glorious adoption of you and all the rest of us in this Body of Christ!
