Seeking the Giver

Advent is upon us again, a time of preparation for the people of God as they anticipate the coming of the Lord. The word "Advent" means "coming," or "arrival," drawing from the Latin word "Adventus." The Greek equivalent is "Parousia." Advent preceding Christmas makes clear that the "coming" upon which we meditate is the Incarnation, but there is also another element: in addition to our focus upon the Lord becoming human 2000 years ago, Advent is also a time of preparation for the Second Coming of Christ, when He comes, as the Creed says, to judge both the living and the dead. Knowing this, how ought we to prepare this year?

The day before Thanksgiving, as I was readying the homily I would be giving during that Wednesday's Low Mass, I was struck by the Old Testament Lesson appointed for the day. It was from Deuteronomy 8. In this passage, Moses instructs the Israelites at the end of their 40 year wilderness sojourn, just before they were to enter the Promised Land. This instruction is a reminder of God's miraculous provision for them during their perilous journey through the desert, followed by a warning of the temptations to come in the land of Canaan. First, the reminder:

2 And you shall remember the whole way that the LORD your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not. 3 And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD.

The times of lack and struggle were resolved by God's provision of "bread from heaven," the manna that appeared in the morning. Moses' explanation is that besides the obvious goal of keeping His people alive, God's purpose in this miracle was to show them that even the most basic elements of life needed to keep one alive ultimately come forth at the command of God. He is the One from whom all blessings flow! When God provides via such conspicuous divine intervention, it is obvious to His people that they are dependent upon Him. However, upon entering the Promised Land, they would be planted in a country that was tremendously fertile, that was "flowing with milk and honey."

This new context, although a consummation of God's promise of blessing, would provide a new temptation about which Moses gives them warning:

11 Take care lest you forget the LORD your God by not keeping his commandments and his rules and his statutes, which I command you today, 12 lest, when you have eaten and are full and have built good houses and live in them, 13 and when your herds and flocks multiply and your silver and gold is multiplied and all that you have is multiplied, 14 then your heart be lifted up, and you forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, 15 who led you through the great and terrifying wilderness, with its fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water, who brought you water out of the flinty rock, 16 who fed you in the wilderness with manna that your fathers did not know, that he might humble you and test you, to do you good in the end. 17 Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.'

This warning is supremely relevant not only to the original hearers, but also to us today, as we too are God's people living in a land of abundance, wealth, and comfort. Although our congregation includes people of various levels of material prosperity, the truth is that our entire society, even those of lesser means, have access to provisions and comforts of which an Ancient Israelite could not have conceived. For this reason, it is critical that we remind ourselves during this Advent and subsequent Christmas seasons of the fact that God is the Source of all our material blessings. The money in our retirement funds, the roofs over our heads, the food on our plates, and all other things upon which we depend—and too often take for granted—stem ultimately from our God's heavenly treasuries. Again, He is the One from whom all blessings flow!

Therefore, rather than divorcing the gift from the Giver and living in a manner that presumes that our earthly success is dependent entirely on our own effort, let us allow God's graciousness to lead us to Him who has granted it. Let us heed Moses' words to the Israelites that follow the above warning:

18 You shall remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your fathers, as it is this day.

As God has blessed us, may we bless His holy Name in return this Advent season. Let us prepare our hearts to praise Him for the Incarnation of His Son, and ready ourselves for His Second Coming, by remembering His goodness and love, utilizing His gifts to bring us ever closer to Him who is the Giver. Amen.

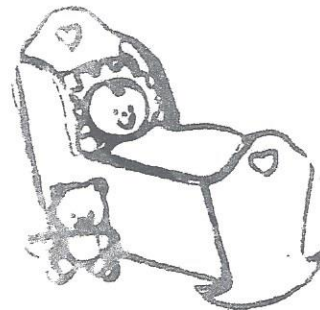
ANGLICANS FOR LIFE

- **40 days for life campaign:** The 40 days for life campaign ended November 5th. Five hundred one lives were confirmed as saved. Since 2007, 24,165 lives have been saved. One hundred forty seven abortion centers have closed and 254 workers no longer work there, that we know about. The spring campaign will begin February 14th and run through March 24th, 2024.
- **October Baby Shower:** Thank you to everyone who participated in the October Baby Shower to benefit First Concern Pregnancy Resource Center at 91 Main Street, Suite 101, Marlborough.

2 x/month – Sundays (1 hour)/Walker Hall, Outreach Building
Begins Jan, 2024
Age 13 – 15 (7th – 9th grade)

People search their whole lives for that one true thing that will give them hope, peace, happiness, order, reconciliation, guidance, internal strength, longevity, and life-giving purpose...

Is that thing something we can tangibly see, hear, taste, smell, and touch? This question needs answers... How do we prepare to embark on this search? Of course, we need skills, tools, and a ready mindset...

This is a collaborative course where teens embark together on a Treasure Hunt which then reveals a Symbolic Road Map. Each Treasure Hunt can span different lengths of time or sessions, so we could embark on several Hunts during the Catechetical Year.

We will draw from Building Blocks and Resources (Holy Bible, Anglican Family Prayer Book, Hymnal, Other Praise Music/Books, & Anglican Teachings to support, direct, and bring revelation to our pursuit.

About the Mentor – Diane O’Leary

A curious child by nature, Diane discovered in her teen years that Jesus is the Light of the World. Walking by faith, she embarked on a journey following Confirmation, participating in, then leading Youth Group at the Church of the Holy Trinity, Marlborough, and the Assabet Valley Episcopal Cluster in her college years. She stepped into an early childhood Catechist role upon the birth of her daughter and developed a homegrown summer Vacation Bible School (V.B.S.) Program for Toddlers held at her home. Soon to follow was a call to serve from Fr. Michael McKinnon and laying on of hands by The Right Reverend Donald Harvey to develop and lead the Youth Ministry Program as Youth Minister - (Children’s Chapel, First Communion, Youth Group, V.B.S., & Related Youth Ministries), which she fulfilled in both paid and volunteer capacities; the latter of which she continues to do today within Holy Trinity Anglican Church.

Other threads in Diane’s life work include Food Security (H.T.A.C. Coordinator to Our Father’s Table and development of June’s Kitchen – a service opportunity for youth), and serving as Treasurer, Committee Chair, and Personal/Financial Management Mentor for Scouts B.S.A. Her practice as a Certified Accountant/Bookkeeper and service in both Liturgical and Financial roles in the Church led her to develop and launch LIFE Skills – A Personal/Financial Management Course for Young Adults to help them prepare for the next chapter of their life after high school by first taking ownership of their Personal Relationship with God.

Treasure Hunters draws on key components of LIFE Skills and incorporates age-appropriate activities within a framework of adventure – seeking and unraveling the mysteries of the divine revealed by God in Jesus Christ by the Power of the Holy Spirit.

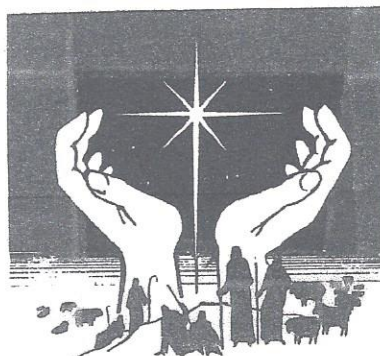
