### Staying the Course with the Savior

Beloved Holy Trinity Family,

As we enter into this holy season of Lent, let us look to our Savior as He labored in the wilderness before the start of His public ministry. After being baptized by St. John, Jesus was "led by the Spirit into the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, he was hungry" (Luke 4:1-2). He entered back into that wilderness through which the Children of Israel had journeyed so many years before; further, He was not at "full strength," but you will note that the Tempter came to Him when He was depleted physically. He had fasted at length, giving up earthly comforts in order more fully to commune with the Father, and had done so for the same length of time that Moses was on the Mount with God. At this time, when He was at His lowest, Satan appeared in order to deceive and master the Lord.

On the contrary, the Devil's plan came to naught because Jesus stayed steadfast on the course that the Father had laid out for Him. He did not give into the temptation, as the Israelites did time and again. When Moses took too long on the Mountain with God, they became impatient. They did not wait upon the Lord, but instead demanded that something be done immediately. So unwilling were they to accept God's timing, that they told Aaron to take all of their gold jewelry, melt it down in the fire, and fashion it into an idol, saying, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt" (Ex. 32:4). Imagine that! These same people who witnessed firsthand the miraculous power of YHWH delivering them from Egypt would just weeks afterward convince themselves that it wasn't God at all!

This may seem farfetched, but this is the very thing that can happen if we do not stay the course with steadfastness, walking in the footsteps of the Lord. Think back upon Jesus' temptation. The Devil finally asked the Lord to bow down and worship him! How in the world could he think such a thing to be even remotely possible? The answer is because he had been successful in getting so many people to walk away from God up to that point. Even after great encounters of God's goodness and power, it is possible that His people lose their faith due to the deceptions that pervade this world and life.

However, if we follow the example of Christ, we are empowered not only to fend off a complete collapse of our faith in the one true God, but also have victory here in this life. Note that the Israelites just barely escaped the wrath of God through the intercession of Moses. Jesus, on the other hand, after trampling Satan underfoot, came out of the desert "in the power of the Spirit," (Luke 4:14) moving immediately to demonstrate the presence of God's Kingdom by performing signs, wonders, and healings. Staying the course is easier said than done, of course; but we have a Savior who has gone before us! There is no temptation, no struggle, no pain that He Himself did not endure. He took it all upon Himself, experiencing much of it during his earthly sojourn, but fully when, on the cross, He was "made" sin (2 Cor. 5:21). The point is that He knows your pain, your heartache, your disappointment. Do not let those things cause you to turn away from Him; rather, realize that He is the ONLY One who can get you successfully through the woes of this life.

Look to your Savior this Lent. Entrust yourself to Him. There is no other Name under heaven by which men must be saved, and there is no hope in anyone or anything else. Cast your cares upon Him, because He cares for you. Know that though you walk through the valley of shadow and death, you need not fear any evil, because He is with you. Take heart and stay the course this Lenten season. Your destiny is to dwell in the House of the Lord forever!

### LENTEN LECTURES

A new annual event at Holy Trinity is The Lenten Lectures. Each year we will host several talks offered for the spiritual edification of our congregation and surrounding community. Some of these lectures will be given by outside scholars. This year our lecture series is "St. Basil the Great on the Spiritual Life." St. Basil, a 4th Century Church Father, was a Bishop in Caesarea who vigorously defended the orthodox understanding of the Trinity against heresy, did much to promote and strengthen the monastic movement, and left us a treasure trove of homilies geared toward bolstering our walk with Christ. He is honored in the West as a Doctor of the Church, and in the East as one of the three Holy Hierarchs of the Church.

This year our lectures will be delivered by:

- Despina D. Prassas, PhD, a Boston-area Patristics Scholar and translator who specializes in St. Maximus the Confessor
- Marcos B. Gouvêa, PhD, a Classicist and ardent student of St. Basil's writings (and also one of HTAC's very own)
- The Rev. Shawn S. Fowler, Rector at Holy Trinity Anglican Church


