#### Overcoming the Distance

As we enter into the first half of Trinitytide, which is the "Ordinary" time after Trinity Sunday that encompasses most of the summer, I want to take some time to reflect on being distant from God. Throughout the length of one's walk with God, which, Lord willing, will constitute many decades, it is common to experience periods of feeling distant from God. This can be a result of unrepentant sin, of course, but also can arise for other reasons, such as unanswered prayers, difficult life circumstances, and doubt-filled thoughts. What do we do when we find ourselves in such situations? Turning to God's Word is always a remedy for the ills of life, and when this particular problem is present, Psalms of lamentation can be of great help. Let's consider Psalms 42-43, which were originally one hymn.

The Psalmist famously begins this song with the verse, "As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God." This is a beautiful, yet powerful statement, and one that we ought to desire to make our own. However, why exactly is he saying this? It is not simply because he wants more of God; it is because he is far from God. In verse 2 he rhetorically asks, "When shall I come and appear before God?" How can he ask such a question? Does one not know when he will be able to worship God? Let's consider more of the text. In verse 3, after stating that his tears have become his food, he explains that others "say to me all the day long, 'where is your God?" Further, he sings, "These things I remember, as I pour out my soul: how I would go with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God with glad shouts and songs of praise, a multitude keeping festival" (V. 4). Now it is starting to make sense. Remember that this is under the Old Covenant, hundred of years before the time of Christ. To "appear before God" meant to worship Him at the Temple in Jerusalem. This person, who must be in the priestly service, probably as a singer or musician, cannot physically go to the Temple at this time. He speaks of people taunting him, who seem to be his enemies. It is possible that he is in exile, having been forcefully taken away to Babylon.

He therefore hungers and thirsts for God as a man who is has been unwillingly deprived of the Lord's presence, a presence that is uniquely manifest at the Temple. Although he protests his situation, still he would have acknowledged the role that the sin of Israel played in this devastating reality. The exile was clearly a consequence given in response to Jacob's unrepentant wickedness. Yet even this situation was not permanent; God's correction is not punitive, but restorative. The Psalmist thus calls on this same God who punished in order that he might restore. He does make known out loud the way he perceives the present: "I say to God, my rock: why have you forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?" (V. 9).

Nevertheless, the answer is not to allow one's inward being to remain perpetually in a state of disillusionment leading to dispondancy. Things may feel bad, and even be bad, at the moment. It may seem like God is nowhere to be found. However, we know in the innermost recesses of our hearts that such is not true. God allows trial; God is known to test. His Word says as much. We must remember that these are allotted to us for the refining of our faith, the strengthening of our hope's resiliency, and the fostering of our love.

Finally, in the second part of this hymn (Psalm 43), we see what he does to stir up, once again, his trust in the Most High. He writes, "Send out your light and your truth; let them lead me; let them bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling! Then I will go to the altar of my God, to God my exceeding joy, and I will praise you with the lyre, O God, my God" (V. 3-4). Call upon God in your moment of distress. In that place of feeling like He is a million miles away, push through and cry out to Him. If a Psalmist of the Old Covenant can be spiritually awakened to trust in God for his return to the Holy Land and the restoration of the Temple, surely we who have been made the Temple of the Holy Ghost by the indwelling of that same Spirit can be stirred inwardly to believe that Christ will do a work in our hearts. The truth is that regardless of how we feel, "he is actually not far from each one of us, for 'In him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:27-28). We do not need God to come to us; He is already here. We need him to peel back the veil, so that we experience more of His presence that is ever surrounding us. God does this throughout Scripture, He has done it during the history of His Church, and He is willing to do it today. Are we willing to step out in faith and ask God to give us a fresh taste of His Holy Spirit, to rekindle within us our "first love?" (Rev. 2:4). As the Psalmist puts it: "Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise Him, my salvation and my God" (43:5).

Please let me or a choir member know if you are interested!






