Going Deeper in Discipleship

Dear HTAC Family,

As we move closer to the end of the Church year, let us consider what the Lord commands us in the Great Commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." Therefore, discipleship is at the core of what a Christian is to do. Not only are we to be discipled; we also are to disciple others. But what is discipleship? The root word in the original language means "learn," so discipleship is essentially learning and to be a disciple is to be a learner. In English, we tend to call learners "students."

That's it; we are ultimately students of Christ, but this comes at least partially through being students of someone further along in the faith. And, Lord willing, we are helping someone else's growth in faith by allowing them to be our students. This may seem alien to the way you have practiced Christianity throughout your life, but this is the biblical model. Jesus made disciples who made disciples, who themselves in turn made disciples, and on and on. Thus, learning and teaching are essential components of the Christian faith. The teaching is to begin, according to the above quote, with all that Jesus had commanded them. However, as the Church age extended further and further into the future, it became necessary to teach also the Scriptures that were to be written down after that point (i.e., the entire New Testament), and also doctrinal and ecclesial development that took place as the years went on (e.g., the declarations of the ecumenical Church councils, including the Creeds).

Fast forward to the 16th century, and the English Reformation brought about significant change to the Anglican Church, leading to the production of the Book of Common Prayer, the 39 Articles, and other important developments. Much of this change was in fact a restoration of earlier doctrinal emphases found in the early Church; such retrieval had been sorely needed for centuries, particularly considering the errors of the Medieval Church such as the doctrine of Purgatory. Arriving at the present moment, we modern, orthodox Anglicans (which constitute roughly 85% of the Global Communion) can confidently assert that we strive to maintain the faith of the undivided Church, which flourished in the first several centuries AD.

Returning to the topic of discipleship: since we have received so great a tradition, built on the foundation of Scripture with Jesus Christ as the cornerstone, let us take seriously the call to be students of the Faith. We must be diligent to go deeper in understanding of what has been handed down to us. Taking seriously our Christian beliefs, and particularly our Christianity as practiced in the Anglican Communion, is a necessity. This is why this month, September of 2024, we are beginning a study that introduces the entirety of Anglicanism. We all will be reading the book *Deep Anglicanism: A Brief Guide*, and I will be expanding on and sometimes critiquing what we read via our Adult Christian

Education classes and through emailed teachings. We will be covering all the essentials of Christianity as practiced in the Anglican Tradition, and also will be careful to cover certain hot-button issues that are relevant to living out the faith in our modern context. Please join us in this journey and fulfill the Lord's command both to be and to make disciples!

PRAYER AND FASTING

To fast and to pray on behalf of our church family is an important ministry in which most of us can participate. For several years Holy Trinity has had a week of fasting and day of prayer each month. We did not schedule specific days for this over the summer because of people's vacations.

If you are not familiar with our monthly practice of Fasting and Prayer, it is as follows: During one week each month we have six days set apart for prayer and fasting. One or more persons sign-up to fast on each of the days appointed (Monday through Saturday). Our week of fasting concludes with a Day of Prayer on the Saturday from 6:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. A minimum of eleven persons sign-up to pray in their own home for one hour. This way at least one person will be fasting every day that week on behalf of the church family and at least one person will be praying from approximately sunup to sundown on the Day of Prayer.




