HTAC Faithful,

Once again, the Lord has been faithful, and by His grace we are at the beginning of yet another year. The Church year begins with Advent, a time of preparation and anticipation. It is a time wherein our "being stuck in the middle" is felt acutely, as we are reminded that the Lord indeed has come the first time, but that there remains to be fulfilled His promise to come again. "Not that the Lord is slack concerning His promise," as we know that He takes His time due to His patience and desire to save those yet to repent; however, to us who operate down here under the heavens, it can seem like an eternity. When pressed with the anxieties and hardships of life, we often turn to God and say like the Psalmist, "How long, O Lord? Will you forget us forever?" And if we don't, perhaps we at least feel like saying this.

It is natural to feel this pulling in both directions; we are grateful for God's truth, for His lovingkindness, for all that He has done and is doing, both in our lives and throughout the history of the world, yet also it can be tough to remain steadfast in our pursuit of Him. It is difficult to live the Christian life when we know that those who follow Christ will endure persecution. We want Him to wrap this all up and take us home to glory. Or sometimes we have the temptation to give up altogether, because we are sick of dealing with everything. Now, of course, what it would look like to "give up" and "not deal with everything" is a bit hazy, but we do know that it isn't what God wants for us. We know in our heart of hearts that, although God does invite us to be real with Him, to share our true emotions and feelings with our true Lord and Master, He does not want us to enter into despair or despondency. This is because despair is the exclusion of hope. When one steps into that sort of state, he or she has necessarily rejected the promises of God; if there is anything we know, it is that God is faithful to His children and that He fulfills His Word. Christ is the very "hope of glory," whose finished work of death, burial, resurrection, and ascension, provides us a hope that is tethered like an anchor fastened to the heavenly Holy Place, as described in Scripture. Thus, regardless of the present circumstances of our lives, we can be certain that God has us in His loving arms and that He is leading us, as a Good Shepherd, towards that which is best for us.

Therefore, may we remind ourselves of God's goodness and loyal love towards us this Advent and Christmas season. Let's get in the Word to review what He has done for His people in the past, let's look to our own lives to stir up the memory of what He's done for us, and may we reach out to one another in love this holiday season and watch as God continues to work in and through us in the present and future, all to the glory of His name!



PRAYER AND FASTING

To fast and to pray on behalf of our church family is an important ministry in which most of us can participate. For several years Holy Trinity has had a week of fasting and day of prayer each month.

If you are not familiar with our monthly practice of Fasting and Prayer, it is as follows: During one week each month we have six days set apart for prayer and fasting. One or more persons sign-up to fast on each of the days appointed (Monday through Saturday). Our week of fasting concludes with a Day of Prayer on the Saturday from 6:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. A minimum of eleven persons sign-up to pray in their own home for one hour. This way at least one person will be fasting every day that week on behalf of the church family and at least one person will be praying from approximately sunup to sundown on the Day of Prayer.




