HTAC Messenger Rector's Address Trinitytide 1 – 2025

HTAC Faithful,

Greetings at the beginning of this year's Trinitytide! As we reflect back on Trinity Sunday and the Word of God that was brought forth during our public worship, I am struck by the atmosphere we see in heaven. Both the Old Testament Lesson of Isaiah 6 and its New Testament counterpart found in Revelation 4 depict the throne room of the Lord. This space features not only the One seated on the throne, but also various attendant beings who surround the seat of power. In Isaiah, these creatures are described as Seraphim, which means "burning ones," whereas in Revelation, there are two groups: twenty-four elders, who themselves are seated on thrones, and four "living creatures," which are clearly the Cherubim described in the book of Ezekiel. These mysterious, awe-inducing entities have provoked the curiosity of countless believers throughout the generations. There is so much that we do not know about them. They obviously have great authority and power, and are privileged to have taken up residence so close to God Himself. Nevertheless, they do not seem all that interested in themselves, or in one another. Rather, they are consumed with the God who rests in their midst; the "burning ones" are fixated on the Sovereign who is described in His Word as "a consuming fire" (Heb. 12:29); the enthroned, crowned elders rush to vacate their chairs and cast their crowns at the feet of Him who is King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Rather than being overly concerned with the nature and function of these shadowy figures, let us instead observe carefully what they do and make strides at their emulation.

The Seraphim of Isaiah's vision cry out, ""Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" Turning to Revelation, the Living Creatures proclaim the following: "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!" This song of praise is nearly identical to that which is offered up by the Seraphim, and intentionally so. When reading the passage, one will also notice that these Creatures lift up this praise night and day without cessation. Over, and over, and over, and over again, they say the same things. How is this possible? How could they redundantly sing the same refrain without getting tired, or bored, or eventually not meaning it? A bit of speculation I once heard, which to me makes great sense, is that our infinite God, whose attributes, including His holiness, goodness, and might, are an inexhaustible, unending sea, allows time and again yet another "layer" of His goodness, awesomeness, and love to be revealed to these elders and creatures; each time they encounter this fresh revelation of the Lord, they cannot help but cry out in songs of praise and worship, or drop to their knees and lay their own crowns down before Him in awe and thanksgiving. We cannot know for sure, but it certainly is true that if God "peels back the veil," as it were, and allows a creature of His to experience even a modicum of His power, that being will be overcome by the immensity of His greatness. Just think of Isaiah's response to seeing the Lord's might in his heavenly vision. This godly prophet says to the Lord. "Woe is me! For I am undone!"

Considering all this, may we, the people of God, learn from the glimpse of heaven that God gives us: it is filled with praise. The worship and praise of God is a central function of His creation, and when His creatures are in His proximity, they naturally fall on their faces and give Him the glory due His Name. Now

it's time to ask: Do we praise God? Do we lift His Name on high? Are we joining with the angels and archangels who evermore sing these songs of praise? This must be done not only in the Mass, but also in our daily lives. You and I are created for praise. Because it is an essential aspect of the life for which God made us, when we engage in such, we not only please the Lord and fulfill His will; we also experience a contentment that only comes when we live according to God's design for our lives. We often spend significant time flirting with sin, or at least not fulfilling exactly what God has intended for us to do; the Bible calls this "kicking against the goads." However, when we submit to God, cease our resistance, and acquiesce to His call upon our lives, there is no greater peace that can be tasted this side of Glory. Start with praise; begin with worship. Incorporate this into your daily routine this Trinitytide. Start to spend a little time each day praising God: list the things for which you are thankful; tell your children stories of how God has provided for you and others; sing a hymn, or popular Christian song; recite aloud Psalms of praise and make them your own. Take just a little time to do one or more of these things each day, and watch as God begins to transform your heart in ways you never thought possible!

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen!



PRAYER AND FASTING

Over the summer months there will be no official Week of Fasting and Day of Prayer. This can be difficult to schedule with so many regular participants taking vacation at different times. Please do continue to fast and pray diligently for our Church family and look for an announcement about this in the next "Messenger".

If you are not familiar with our monthly practice of Fasting and Prayer, it is as follows: During one week each month we have six days set apart for prayer and fasting. One or more persons sign-up to fast on each of the days appointed (Monday through Saturday). Our week of fasting concludes with a Day of Prayer on the Saturday from 6:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. A minimum of eleven persons sign-up to pray in their own home for one hour. This way at least one person will be fasting every day that week on behalf of the church family and at least one person will be praying from approximately sunup to sundown on the Day of Prayer.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd





We now have three groups: Level I (ages 3-6), led by Cate Fowler; Level II (ages 6-9), led by Monica Walker; and Level III (ages 9-12), led by Diana Newton Wood. Parents and others assist in the Atrium each week for which we are very grateful. Several of these assistants have taken – or plan to take – Atrium assistant training online and that is a great blessing.

Our final Atrium prior to summer break will be June 15th. We will start up again the second or third week of September.


